Part A. Describe the actions taken, under national legislation, in the previous year to implement conservation and management measures adopted by the Commission at its sixteenth Session.

Resolution 14/01 On the removal of obsolete Conservation and Management Measures

A consultancy has been procured through the IOTC coordination that is providing legal assistance to transpose IOTC Resolutions into National legal Instruments. The Laws and Regulations governing Tuna fisheries are also being nationally reviewed. The outcome of the two exercises will result in the removal of all obsolete conservation and management measures in national legislation if exist.

Resolution 14/02 For the conservation and management of tropical tunas stocks in the IOTC area of competence

The United Republic of Tanzania is implementing a Tuna Fishery Management Strategy with guidelines on data collection and dissemination pertaining to the artisanal fleet (See the attached Tanzania Tuna Fisheries Management Strategy)

Resolution 14/03 On enhancing the dialogue between fisheries scientists and managers

Participated in the Science and Management Dialog workshops in South Africa and Thailand.

Resolution 14/04 Concerning the IOTC record of vessels authorised to operate in the IOTC area of competence a

Submitted to Secretariat a list of the Tanzanian flagged vessels greater than 24 meters with all the required information set by Resolution 14/04

Tanzania noted Paragraph 7 of the Resolution regarding Citizenship or Legal entities of owners of the (Tanzania Flagged) vessels. To be included in the Review of legislation that is ongoing.

Statistical Documents are being validated.

Document mandatory to carry onboard Tanzania Flagged Vessels include all requirements set by Paragraph 13.

A bound fishing national logbook is mandatory to carry on board for Tanzania Flagged Vessels.

Resolution 14/05 Concerning a record of licensed foreign vessels fishing for IOTC species in the IOTC area of competence and access agreement information ^a





Submitted to the IOTC secretariat record of licensed foreign vessels with all information required by the Resolution.

Resolution 14/06 On establishing a programme for transhipment by large-scale fishing vessels ^a *Tanzania Law does not allow at sea transhipment.*

Tanzanian Flagged Vessels are obligated to follow the requirements set out in Annex 1 of this resolution when transhipping at port.

Large Scale Tuna Longline Vessels (LSTLVs) are subjected to IOTC program to monitor transhipment at sea.

List of Authorised Carrier Vessels submitted to the secretariat with all requirements set out in Paragraph 6 of this Resolution.

Addition and deletion of the above mentioned list communicated to the secretariat.

Transhipment Statistical Documents validated with reported catch amount of each LSTLVs in the fleet.

Recommendation 05/07 Concerning a management standard for the tuna fishing vessels

The CPC flag states which issues licenses to their AFVs should report annually to the Commission all measures taken to meet the minimum management standards when they issue fishing licenses to their "authorised fishing vessels".

Memorundam of Understanding signed with companies operating flagged vessel that bind the companies to comply with all IOTC minimum management standards.

Terms & Conditions of ATF requires vessels to conform to all Tanzanian Laws and international laws that the country is party to.

Resolution 10/06 On Reducing the Incidental Bycatch of Seabirds in Longline Fisheries

CPCs shall provide to the Commission, as part of their annual reports, information on how they are implementing this measure and all available information on interactions with seabirds, including bycatch by fishing vessels carrying their flag or authorised to fish by them. This is to include details of species where available to enable the Scientific Committee to annually estimate seabird mortality in all fisheries within the IOTC Area of Competence.

All Flagged vessels have been required to conform fully to the requirement of Resolution 10/06 through the signing of MoU (attached in last year's report of implementation) as a condition for obtaining Authorisation to Fish.

Resolution 10/10 Concerning market related measures

For CPCs that import tuna and tuna-like fish products, or in whose ports those products are landed or transhipped, should report, a range of information (e.g. information on vessels / owners, product data (species, weight), point of export) annually. [A template report exists].
