# Report of Implementation for the year 2015

**Part A**. Describe the actions taken, under national legislation, in the previous year to implement conservation and management measures adopted by the Commission at its Nineteenth Session.

- Resolution 15/11 On the implementation of a limitation of fishing capacity of Contracting Parties and Cooperating Non-Contracting Parties.
  - Since 1 January 2014, there are no more vessels flying the flag of France (Territories) on the Record of vessels authorized to fish for species under the IOTC mandate. The vessels previously listed in the IOTC record under the France (territories) flag and the corresponding capacity limitation plans were transferred to the flag of France as part of the the European Union.
- Resolution 15/10 On target and limit reference points and a decision framework.
   French scientists have participated in the work of the Scientific Committee and its working parties to implement this resolution for France (territories).
- Resolution 15/09 On a fish aggregating devices (FADs) working group.
  - Several research activities are conducted by French scientists and may provide information for the activities and research of the future working party on fish aggregating devices. Research programs and work have been described in the national report provided by France (territories) to the 2015 Scientific Committee.
  - The number of DCP deployed by quarter and type of FAD were provided to IOTC for the time period 2010-2014. The logbooks of French purse seiners were extended in January 2013 to incorporate the deployment activities and a summary of the deployment areas by quarter was presented in document OTC-2014-WPTT16-20. The French vessel owners have set up a unique non entangling DCP design built on land in Victoria (Seychelles), following a design certified by Bureau Veritas. The documents describing this design were provided to IOTC.
- Resolution 15/08 Procedures on fish aggregating devices (FADs) management plan, including a limitation on the number of FADs, more detailed specifications of catch reporting from FAD sets, and the development of improved FAD designs to reduce the incidence of entanglement of non-target species.





Decree No. 2014-51 of 23 April 2014 prescribing the rules governing the exercise of fishing for tuna and other pelagic fish in the EEZs of the Scattered Islands is currently being revised to incorporate provisions on the limitation of DCP in waters under the jurisdiction of France (territories). The provisions relating to declaration of data about sets on DCPs and the development of a better design of FADs to reduce non-target species entanglement are already integrated in Decree No. 2014-51 of April 23 2014.

- Resolution 15/07 On the use of artificial lights to attract fish to drifting fish aggregating devices.
   The use of artificial light to attract fish around FADs is prohibited in waters under the jurisdiction of France (territories) and will be included in the amended decree No. 2014-51 of April 23, 2014 prescribing rules governing the exercise of fishing for tuna and other pelagic fish in the EEZs of the Scattered Islands.
- Resolution 15/06 On a ban on discards of bigeye tuna, skipjack tuna, yellowfin tuna, and a
  recommendation for non-targeted species caught by purse seine vessels in the IOTC area of
  competence.

Decree No. 2014-51 of 23 April 2014 prescribing the rules governing the exercise of fishing for tuna and other pelagic fish in the EEZs of the Scattered Islands prohibits discards of bigeye, skipjack and yellowfin tunas and also the recommendation [sic] on non-target species in the IOTC area.

• Resolution 15/05 On conservation measures for striped marlin, black marlin and blue marlin.

Since 1 January 2014, there are no more vessels flying the flag of France (Territories) on the record of vessels authorized to fish for IOTC species. Some scientists from France (territories), have participated in the work of the Scientific committee that produced the recommendations on the management of these species.

 Resolution 15/04 Concerning the IOTC record of vessels authorised to operate in the IOTC Area of Competence.

Since 1 January 2014, there are no more vessels flying the flag of France (Territories) on the record of vessels authorized to fish for IOTC species.

Resolution 15/03 On the vessel monitoring system (VMS) Programme.

Since 1 January 2014, there are no more vessels flying the flag of France (Territories) on the record of vessels authorized to fish for IOTC species. Decree No. 2014-51 of 23 April 2014 prescribing the rules governing the exercise of fishing for tuna and other pelagic fish in the EEZs of the Scattered Islands requires that authorized vessels be equipped with VMS, consistent with resolution 1503 .

• Resolution 15/02 On mandatory statistical reporting requirements for IOTC Contracting Parties and Cooperating Non-Contracting Parties (CPCs).

Since 1 January 2014, there are no more vessels flying the flag of France (Territories) on the record of vessels authorized to fish for IOTC species.





 Resolution 15/01 On the recording of catch and effort data by fishing vessels in the IOTC Area of Competence.

Decree No. 2014-51 of 23 April 2014 prescribing the rules governing the exercise of fishing for tuna and other pelagic fish in the EEZs of the Scattered Islands requires that the recording of catch and effort by vessels fishing in the IOTC area meet the regulatory requirements of the IOTC.

Additional information:

No export operation is currently made from a port of landing located in a French territory. None of the vessels authorized to fish in the French waters of the Mozambique Channel have landed their catch in a French port of the Southern Indian Ocean. Therefore, there has been no export of bigeye tuna originating from the French Overseas Territories.

#### Additional information:

Nine observers were deployed in 2014 on tuna purse-seiners licensed to operate in the waters of the Scattered Islands. These observers carried out observations for a total of 392,5 days, including 5 days in the French waters. Observer trip reports were communicated to French authorities and coastal States, for the part on their EEZ. The information collected under these observer trips was sent to the IOTC by the Institute of Research for Development (IRD).

In 2015, 10 observers from France (territories) have covered 18 trips of 5 French purse seiners, 2 Spanish purse seiners, 2 Seychellois purse seiners and 1 Italian purse seiner. These observations amount to a total of 518 days at sea, including 29 days (5.6%) in the waters of the Scattered Islands.





France (territories) participated in the coordination meetings of States managers for scientific fisheries observer organized by Smartfish-IOC. These biannual meetings allow to establish a provisional boarding list of regional fisheries observers from member states of the IOC and France (territories).

Resolution 12/04 On marine turtles

CPCs shall report to the Commission, in accordance with Article X of the IOTC Agreement, their progress of implementation of the FAO Guidelines and this Resolution.

Annex II of Decree No. 2014-51 dated April 23rd 2014 (TAAF), stating the rules governing tuna fisheries and other pelagic fisheries in the EEZs of the Scattered Islands, provides for the recording of data on interactions with marine turtles and the requirement, for the various gear types (purse seine, net, handline-longline-pole and line), to release marine turtles in decree to increase their chances of survival, as well as a FAD design requirement to avoid all risks of marine turtle entanglement.

Resolution 12 /06 On Reducing the Incidental Bycatch of Seabirds in Longline Fisheries
 CPCs shall provide to the Commission, as part of their annual reports, information on how they are implementing this measure and all available information on interactions with seabirds, including bycatch by fishing vessels carrying their flag or authorised to fish by them. This is to include details of species where available to enable the Scientific Committee to annually estimate seabird mortality in all fisheries within the IOTC Area of Competence.

Annex II of Decree No. 2014-51 dated April 23rd 2014, stating the rules governing tuna fisheries and other pelagic fisheries in the EEZs of the Scattered Islands, lays down provisions, applicable to vessels using longline and pole-and-line gears, allowing to mitigate incidental interactions with seabirds. These provisions include the mandatory use of circle hooks and at least one additional device to avoid interactions, as well as measures in terms of waste management and reporting requirements. Information on interactions were transmitted in the National report of France (territories) to the IOTC Scientific Committee.

• Resolution 12/12 To Prohibit the use of large-scale driftnets on the high seas in the IOTC Area

CPCs shall include in their Annual Report a summary of monitoring, control, and surveillance actions related to large-scale driftnet fishing on the high seas in the IOTC area of competence.

The use of gillnets is banned since 2008 (Article 5 of modified TAAF Decree No. 2008-06).

Resolution 13/04 On the conservation of cetaceans

CPCs shall report, in accordance with Article X of the IOTC Agreement, any instances in which cetaceans have been encircled by the purse seine nets of their flagged vessels.

CPCs shall review their own internal actions and measures taken pursuant to paragraph 7, including punitive actions and sanctions and, in a manner consistent with domestic law as regards disclosure, report the results of the review to the Commission annually. In consideration of the results of such review, the Commission shall, if appropriate, request the flag CPCs of AFVs on the IOTC Record to take further action to enhance compliance by those vessels with IOTC Conservation and Management Measures.
