**REPORTING REQUIREMENTS**

This resolution supersedes Resolutions 14/06, 12/05, 11/05, 08/02 & 06/02. Its aim is to eliminate IUU fishing and the laundering of illegal tuna into market streams by monitoring transshipments, based on notifications, authorizations and data transmissions. There are several reporting requirements under this resolution which all apply to flag State CPCs.

Submit to IOTC the list of carrier vessels authorized to receive at-sea transshipments

Notify the Secretariat of any changes to list of authorized carrier vessels

Submit to IOTC a report on observer conclusions for LSTLVs having transhipped

Report to IOTC on quantities and list of LSTLVs that have transhipped during previous year

Report to IOTC the details on the transshipment by flag vessels in foreign ports

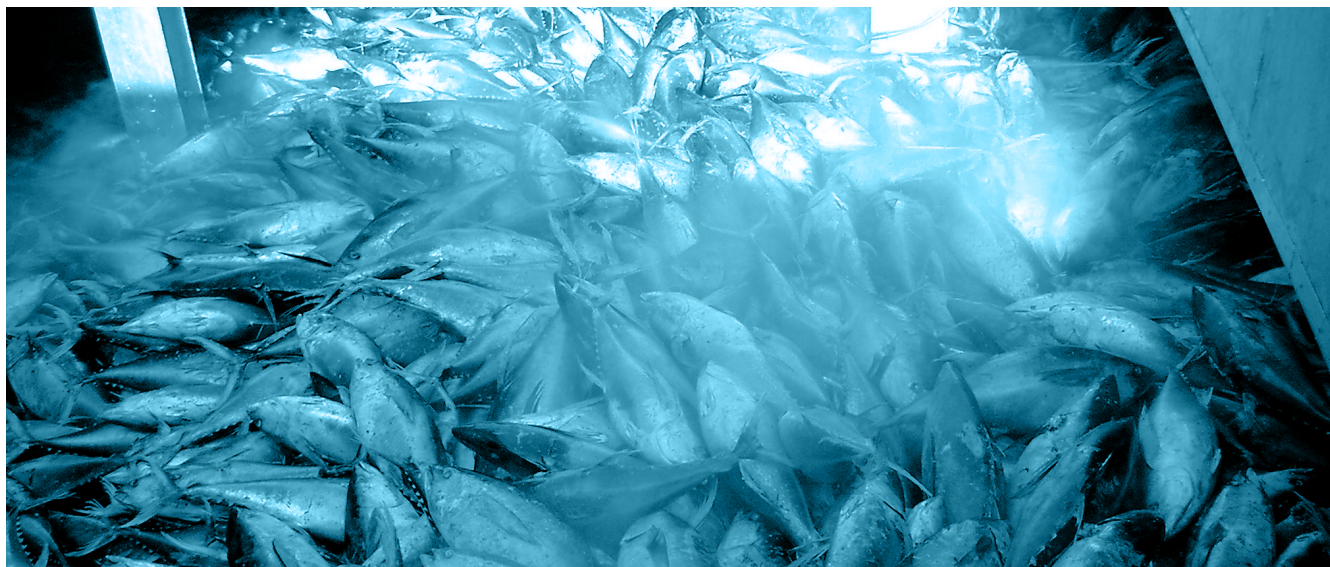

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: FORMAT AND CONTENT

Several reporting template forms have been developed by the Secretariat for CPCs to submit information to the Commission under this resolution. Form templates for reporting at sea transshipments cover the authorised list of carrier vessels, the records of quantities and LSTLVs that have transhipped in the previous year, and the summary of observer programme conclusions on the activities of LSTLVs. Form templates for port transshipments cover the detail on the transshipments conducted by flag vessel in foreign ports. REPORTING ON AT SEA TRANSHIPMENTS

REPORTING REQUIREMENT 1:

SUBMIT TO IOTC THE LIST OF CARRIER VESSELS AUTHORIZED TO RECEIVE AT-SEA TRANSHIPMENTS

IMPLEMENTATION

- How to report: CPCs are required to notify a list of authorised carrier vessels to the Secretariat. The template developed by the Secretariat, which prescribes the format of information to be submitted, should be followed. It contains a guide on how to complete the report, and which information to provide.

REPORTING REQUIREMENT 2:

NOTIFY THE SECRETARIAT OF ANY CHANGES TO LIST OF AUTHORIZED CARRIER VESSELS

IMPLEMENTATION

- How to report: CPCs should report any changes to list of authorized carrier vessels. The same form as above is used, and the nature of the reporting is indicated in the appropriate field (deletion/addition/modification).

REPORTING REQUIREMENT 3:

SUBMIT TO IOTC A REPORT ON OBSERVER CONCLUSIONS FOR LSTLVs HAVING TRANSHIPPED

IMPLEMENTATION

- How to report: This report is to be submitted by the flag State of its LSTLVs that have transhipped in the previous year. It is based on the observer reports having been submitted to it by the IOTC Secretary, obtained via the flag State of the carrier vessels operating the observer programs. A template for this report has been developed by the Secretariat. CPCs should follow the reporting outline proposed in the template.

REPORTING REQUIREMENT 4:

REPORT TO IOTC ON QUANTITIES AND LIST OF LSTLVs THAT HAVE TRANSHIPPED DURING PREVIOUS YEAR

IMPLEMENTATION

- How to report: A template for this report has been developed by the Secretariat. CPCs should follow the reporting outline proposed in the template. The template provides one sheet for the quantities transhipped by species – on a transshipment basis – and it provides one sheet to provide a summary of all the LSTLVs that have transhipped under its jurisdiction.

REPORTING ON TRANSHIPMENTS IN PORT

REPORTING REQUIREMENT 5:

REPORT TO IOTC THE DETAILS ON THE TRANSSHIPMENT BY FLAG VESSELS IN FOREIGN PORTS

IMPLEMENTATION

- How to report: A template for this report has been developed by the Secretariat. CPCs should follow the reporting outline proposed in the template. The template provides one sheet to detail all the LSTLVs that have transhipped including quantity by species.

COOPERATION REQUIREMENTS

Port States and coastal States, when verifying landings of transhipped catches, or transshipments in their EEZs, shall cooperate with flag States of LSTLVs to ensure that quantities landed match original quantities declared (see port State actions above).

OBLIGATIONS OF THE INDUSTRY

Industry actors, in particular the operators of fishing and carrier vessels (Masters), must implement the applicable provisions of the resolution. There are various reporting requirements for the Masters of either, or both the LSTLV and the carrier vessel to their flag States, the port State and coastal State, both prior to, and after the landing or transshipment. Although these reporting requirements are not detailed herein, the CPC flag States of the LSTLV and the carrier vessel are responsible for compliance with this resolution, therefore they and the Masters should be familiar with the details of these reporting requirements.

All carrier vessels authorised to receive transshipments must install and operate a VMS.

The requirement to carry an observer on-board authorised carrier vessels (under the Regional Observer Programme) is provided for under paragraph 17, with the details of observer duties and reporting addressed under Resolution 11/04.

OBLIGATIONS OF THE SECRETARIAT

The IOTC Secretariat plays a central role in the programme as a facilitator of information flows, especially with respect to the flow of information emanating from the observer programme. The IOTC Executive Secretary also bears the responsibility for maintaining the record of carrier vessels authorised to receive transshipments and publishing the Record by posting it on the IOTC website, accommodating the confidentiality requirements (paragraph 8).

OBLIGATIONS OF THE COMMISSION & BODIES

The Compliance Committee shall review the response to possible infractions.

The IOTC Compliance Committee - in 2019 - shall examine the results of a two-year pilot project testing an Indonesian national observer programme aboard eight wooden-hulled carrier vessels, including data collection, reports and the effectiveness of the approach - on the basis of a report prepared by Indonesia and analysis by the IOTC Secretariat.



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
