Part A. Describe the actions taken, under national legislation, in the previous year to implement conservation and management measures adopted by the Commission at its sixteenth Session.

- Resolution 14/01 On the removal of obsolete Conservation and Management Measures
 In considering the UK(OT) response to these questions please note the context. The UK
 (BIOT) Authority does not operate a flag registry, BIOT does not have a fleet of commercial
 fishing vessels, and there is no commercial port in BIOT. The waters of the Territory were
 declared a Marine Protected Area (MPA) on 1 April 2010 and from 1 November 2010
 became a no-take MPA to commercial fishing. An MPA exclusion zone covering Diego Garcia
 and its territorial waters exists where pelagic and demersal recreational fisheries are
 permitted. The recreational fishery catches some tuna and tuna like species.
- 2. Resolution 14/02 For the conservation and management of tropical tunas stocks in the IOTC area of competence

This Resolution removed the IOTC closure but retained options for quota allocation and alternative management measures. The Commission in 2014 requested that the SC examine the effect of the IOTC and BIOT closures. UK(OT) presented two papers to the WPTT in 2014 on the impact of IO closures.
