Part A. Describe the actions taken, under national legislation, in the previous year to implement conservation and management measures adopted by the Commission at its NineteenthSession.

- Resolution 15/11 On the implementation of a limitation of fishing capacity of Contracting Parties and Cooperating Non-Contracting Parties.^a
 - Kenya has provided a fleet deeliopent plan on [16th March 2016].
 - Kenya has already confirmed that it did not have vessels targeting tropical tunas in 2006.
 - Kenya has already confirmed it s baseline capacity for vessels targeting swordfish and albacore in 2007.
- Resolution 15/10 On target and limit reference points and a decision framework.
 Kenya is participating in the process to determine the most suitable exploitation regime of the resources.
- Resolution 15/09 On a fish aggregating devices (FADs) working group.
 Kenya is prepared to join this Working Group. Kenya has already introduced in her national legislation the concept of controlling the number of FADs that can be deployed in her waters.
- Resolution 15/08 Procedures on fish aggregating devices (FADs) management plan, including a limitation on the number of FADs, more detailed specifications of catch reporting from FAD sets, and the development of improved FAD designs to reduce the incidence of entanglement of non-target species.^a
 - Kenya has already introduced in her national legislation the concept of controlling the number of FADs that can be deployed in her waters.
- Resolution 15/07 On the use of artificial lights to attract fish to drifting fish aggregating devices.





Kenya has already introduced in her national legislation the concept of controlling the number of FADs that can be deployed in her waters, including the possibility of banning the use of artificial lights on FADs in Fisheries Regulations.

Resolution 15/06 On a ban on discards of bigeye tuna, skipjack tuna, yellowfin tuna, and a
recommendation for non-targeted species caught by purse seine vessels in the IOTC area of
competence.

Kenya is very supportive of the ban of discards of biegeye tuna, skipjack tuna and yellowfin tuna. The ban of discards of the above-mentioned species is being articulated in the draft Fisheries Regulations.

- Resolution 15/05 On conservation measures forstriped marlin, black marlin and blue marlin. Kenya does not currently have a commercial fishery for striped marlin, black marlin and blue marlin. The Government and the sports fishing industry have been supporting the tag and release of these three species. Kenya provide statistics from the sports fishery on an annual basis to the IOTC Secretariat and contribute papers to the IOTC Working Party on Billfish, c.f. IOTC-2015-WPB13-15. The average number of billfishes that were caught and released in the sports fishery for the period 2009 2014 is 127 p.a.
- Resolution 15/04 Concerning the IOTC record of vessels authorised to operate in the IOTC Area of Competence.^a

Kenya does not currently have any vessel listed in the IOTC Record of Authorised Vessels.

Reporting on IMO number:

To allow the necessary time for CPCs to obtain an IMO number for eligible vessels that do not already have one, paragraph 2.b on IMO number is effective as of 1 January 2016. As of this date, CPCs shall ensure that all their fishing vessels that are registered on the IOTC Record of fishing vessels have IMO numbers issued to them. Paragraph 2.b on IMO number does not apply to vessels which are not eligible to receive IMO numbers.

In assessing compliance with the paragraph above, the Commission shall take into account exceptional circumstances in which a vessel owner is not able to obtain an IMO number despite following the appropriate procedures. Flag CPCs shall report any such exceptional situations to the IOTC Secretariat.

- Resolution 15/03 On the vessel monitoring system (VMS) Programme.^a
 Kenya does not currently have any vessel listed in the IOTC Record of Authorised Vessels. Kenya is currently in the process of procuring a VMS to monitor the foreign fleets licensed to operate inside the Kenyan EEZ.
- Resolution 15/02 On mandatory statistical reporting requirements for IOTC Contracting Parties and Cooperating Non-Contracting Parties (CPCs).

In order to improve the capture of data from the artisanal fishery, Kenya has made arequest to the IOTC Secretariat for support, geared towards improving the data collection system and species identifications, especially with regards to the difficuties to identify juvenile yellowfin tuna and bigeye tuna. Due to the remoteness of some landing stations, Kenya's request was with regards to the use of development in information technology; use of PDA.

 Resolution 15/01 On the recording of catch and effort data by fishing vessels in the IOTC Area of Competence.

Kenya does not currently have any vessel listed in the IOTC Record of Authorised Vessels. Foreign vessels licesensed to operate in the Kenyan EEZ are required to submit their flag State's logbook for the period in which they operate in the Kenyan EEZ. Kenya will monitor the conformity of these logbooks with regards to Annexes I and II of this Resolution, and where required Kenya will request that all mandatory species are included in these logbooks.

A new Fisheries Bill is currently under consideration by the Kenyan Parliament. In parallel, the Fisheries Regulations are being revised to incorporate IOTC CMMs that are required to be transposed in the nationa legal framework.

Resolution 12 /06 On Reducing the Incidental Bycatch of Seabirds in Longline Fisheries





CPCs shall provide to the Commission, as part of their annual reports, information on how they are implementing this measure and all available information on interactions with seabirds, including bycatch by fishing vessels carrying their flag or authorised to fish by them. This is to include details of species where available to enable the Scientific Committee to annually estimate seabird mortality in all fisheries within the IOTC Area of Competence.

CPCs shall review their own internal actions and measures taken pursuant to paragraph 7, including punitiveactions and sanctions and, in a manner consistent with domestic law as regards disclosure, report the results of the review to the Commission annually. In consideration of the results of such review, the Commission shall, if appropriate, request the flag CPCs of AFVs on the IOTC Record to take further action to enhancecompliance by those vessels with IOTC Conservation and Management Measures.

The flag CPCs of the vessels on the record shall:

• take measures to ensure that their AFVs comply with all the relevant IOTC Conservation and Management Measures;
