

# 4. Registration

This is essential to allow the Secretariat and the host country, China, to make the necessary arrangement. Please send an email to Dr. Jiangfeng Zhu after registration.

# 5. Arrival and entry formalities

Participants should make their own arrangements for their entry visa in China and it is recommended to do so as soon as possible. It is therefore imperative that you contact your Chinese Embassy or Chinese Consulate within the best delays in order to apply for a visa. Please note that you will have to send your passport and a photo together with your visa application, and you need to allow sufficient time for your visa to be processed and your passport to be returned to you.

# 6. Travel and transportation

Participants are requested to make their own travel arrangement and fund the expenses incurred. Participants should also make their own airport transfers and transports arrangements between their hotel and airports. There are two international airports in Shanghai, i.e., Pudong International Airport in eastern Shanghai and Hongqiao International Airport in western Shanghai. Some suggestions for the transports between airports and hotel are:

# From Pudong airport to Paradise Hotel:

- By taxi: Costs about 180 RMB and takes about 40 minutes (depending on traffic).
- **By metro**: take metro Line 2 (green line) at the airport and stop at **Century Avenue Station** (14 stops), and then connect (get off and transfer inside the station) to Line 4 (purple line) to stop at **Dalian Road Station** (3 stops), and then connect (get off and transfer inside the station) to Line 12 (dark green line) to stop at **Longchang Road Station** (3 stops). Exit from the gate # 2 of the Longchang Road Station and walk about 5 mins to the Paradise Hotel. It totally takes about 75 mins and costs about 10 RMB.

### From Hongqiao airport to Paradise Hotel:

- By taxi: Costs about 150 RMB and takes about 30 minutes (depending on traffic).
- By metro: take metro Line 2 (green line) at the airport and stop at Century Avenue Station (13 stops), and then connect (get off and transfer inside the station) to Line 4 (purple line) to stop at Dalian Road Station (3 stops), and then connect (get off and transfer inside the station) to Line 12 (dark green line) to stop at Longchang Road Station (3 stops). Exit from the gate # 2 of the Longchang Road Station and walk about 5 mins to the Paradise Hotel. It totally takes about 75 mins and costs about 10 RMB.

Note: The metro system, which connects to most of the hotspot areas in the city, is very convenient in Shanghai. The metro Line 2 connects the two airports. You can find the metro map in detail at:

# 9. Electricity

Electricity in China is 220 Volts, 50 Hertz. Plugs are sockets "Chinese" type. It is recommended to delegates to bring adequate adaptors with them.

International dialling code

The International dialling code for China is +86

Mobile services: Several operators are offering SIM card and prepaid recharge for mobile phones.

### 11. Internet

Wi-Fi facility will be available in the meeting area and Internet service at hotel will be available at room.

# 12. Currency and exchange

The currency in China is the Yuan Renminbi (RMB). The current exchange rates are (10/05/2016): 1 USD  $\approx 6.5$  RMB

Most credit cards are commonly accepted in China.
