



### APPLICATIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE IV.2 OF THE AGREEMENT, AND FOR ACQUISITION OF THE COOPERATING NON-CONTRACTING PARTY STATUS

#### **PURPOSE**

To provide the Commission with an opportunity to consider the applications for Contracting Party (Members) status in accordance with article IV.2 of the Agreement, and for acquisition of the Cooperating Non-Contracting Party (CNCP) status, in accordance with Rule IX of the IOTC Rules of Procedure (2014).

#### BACKGROUND

#### Contracting Party (Member) status:

Democratic People's Republic of Korea: On the 6<sup>th</sup> April 2017, in conformity with the provisions of Article XVII.1 of the Agreement for the Establishment of the Indian Ocean Tuna Commission (1993), an instrument of acceptance of the Agreement by the Government of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea was submitted for consideration to the Director-General of the FAO.

The Democratic People's Republic of Korea, a member of FAO, is not a coastal State situated wholly or partly within the Area of the Agreement. Based on the information available to the Depositary, vessels of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea do not engage in fishing in the Area for stocks covered by the Agreement. Therefore, the elegibility criteria set forth in the text of the IOTC Agreement are not fulfilled.

At its Thirteenth Session in 2009, the Commission recommended that, when the eligibility criteria are not met, the Depository should seek the views of the Members of the Commission. Accordingly, the Members are invited to inform the Commission of the opinion they may have in the context of this issue.

#### Cooperating Non-Contracting Party (CNCP) status:

The IOTC Rules of Procedure (2014), Rule IX, require the following action in regards to 'Cooperating Non-Contracting Party status':


- 1. The Chairperson or the Vice-Chairperson acting as Chairperson of the Commission, shall annually send a letter to all non-Contracting Parties known to be fishing in the IOTC area of competence for species covered by the Agreement to urge them to become a Contracting Party to IOTC or attain the status of a Cooperating Non-Contracting Party. In doing so, the Chairperson or the Vice-Chairperson shall instruct the Executive Secretary to provide a copy of all relevant Conservation and Management *Measures adopted by the Commission.*
- 2. The application process for requesting the status of Cooperating Non-Contracting Party is provided at Appendix III. [of the IOTC Rules of Procedure (2014)]

#### **DISCUSSION**

In accordance with Rule IX, paragraph 1 of the IOTC Rules of Procedure (2014) (shown above), on 6 February 2017 letters of invitation to become either a Contracting Party or a Cooperating Non-Contracting Party of the IOTC, were communicated to each of the eleven (11) remaining coastal States of the IOTC area of competence, who are not currently CPCs.

Update: Of the 11 Non-CPCs contacted, no response has been received.

#### Cooperating Non-Contracting Party (CNCP) status: 2016-17 CNCPs

At the 20<sup>th</sup> Session of the Indian Ocean Tuna Commission (IOTC), held in La Reunion, France from 23 -27 May 2016, the Commission granted the status of Cooperating Non-Contracting Party (CNCP) to the following four (4) countries until the close of the 21<sup>st</sup> Session in 2017 (22–25 May 2017).

- Bangladesh
- Djibouti
- Liberia
- Senegal

•

In accordance with the IOTC Rules of Procedure (2014), Appendix III paragraph 1, invitations were sent to each of the four (4) current CNCPs on 6 February 2017, requesting that they consider submitting an application for renewal of their CNCP status to the IOTC. The CNCPs were reminded that in accordance with the IOTC Rules of Procedure (2014), a formal request needs to be made to the IOTC Executive Secretary no later than ninety (90) days in advance of the next Session of the Commission, which in this case was **15 February 2017**.

Each CNCP was also reminded of the following decision taken by the Commission at its 19<sup>th</sup> Annual Session:

"The Commission AGREED that applications for CNCP status shall no longer be considered unless the applications are submitted on time and in accordance with Rule IX.2 Appendix III, of the IOTC Rules of Procedure (2014), and that the concerned parties are present at the Compliance Committee and Commission meetings to present their application and respond to questions from CPCs. One of the key requirements is for applications to be received by the Executive Secretary no later than ninety (90) days in advance of an Annual Session of the Commission, to be considered at that meeting" (Paragraph 82, IOTC–2015–S19–R[E]: 155 pp)

Provided at **Appendix I** are the details for each CNCP application received for consideration by the Commission in 2016.

#### **RECOMMENDATION/S**

That the Commission:

- 1) **NOTE** paper IOTC-2017-S21-06 which provided the Commission with an opportunity to consider the applications for Contracting Party (Member) status in accordance with article IV.2 of the Agreement, and for acquisition of the Cooperating Non-Contracting Party (CNCP) status, in accordance with Rule IX of the IOTC Rules of Procedure (2014).
- 2) **CONSIDER** the situation of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, given that it is not a coastal State situated wholly or partly within the Area of the Agreement. It would also appear that the vessels of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea do not engage in fishing in the Area, for stocks covered by the Agreement.
- 3) **CONSIDER** whether to renew or grant the status of Cooperating Non-Contracting Party to the four (4) applicants received in 2017, until the close of the 22<sup>nd</sup> Session in 2018, taking into consideration the deliberations at the 14<sup>th</sup> Session of the Compliance Committee.
