

INFORMATION ABOUT ALLEGED ILLEGAL, UNREPORTED AND UNREGULATED FISHING ACTIVITY

I am writing to provide information about Australia's recent apprehension of the Indonesian-flagged fishing vessel *KM Perintis Jaya 19* (call sign YEB5465) after it was detected in Australia's exclusive economic zone, north-west of Broome, Western Australia, on 16 February 2018.

On 17 February 2018, Australian authorities apprehended the vessel for suspected illegal fishing inside Australian waters. The vessel was inspected at sea and taken to the port of Darwin for further investigation. Australian authorities found approximately 4,000 kilograms of mixed species and 200 live bait fish on board.

Charges have been laid against the master and a senior crew member of the vessel and the matter are now before the Supreme Court of the Northern Territory. These are allegations only at this stage and it is not clear when legal proceedings will be finalised.

Australia acknowledges the obligations and procedures set out in IOTC Resolution 17/03 on establishing a list of vessels presumed to have carried out illegal, unregulated and unreported fishing in the IOTC Area of competence. Australia will provide further information to the IOTC, including in accordance with Resolution 17/03 as required, after the court case is concluded.
