NOTIFICATION OF THE 2ND JOINT TUNA RFMO FAD WORKING GROUP MEETING

In 2017 the first meeting of the joint Tuna-RFMO FAD Working Group was held in Madrid, Spain. The Kobe process Steering Committee had previously identified the benefits of coordinating the work of t-RFMOs on FAD related issues, and the need to hold a Joint t-RFMOs FADs working group meeting. The high level of participation at the first meeting reflected the considerable interest that stakeholders have in this topic.

The Inter-American Tropical Tuna Commission (IATTC) has been designated to organize and convene a second meeting of the Joint Tuna RFMOs FAD Working Group, and this will take place in San Diego, California, USA from 8 to 10 May 2019.

I would like to draw your attention to the attached letter from the IATTC Director that includes information on the meeting format, logistics, and a provisional meeting agenda.

Dear colleague:

I am writing to you as a follow-up to the letter that the IATTC chairman and I sent on 11 December 2018 in relation to the convening of the Joint Tuna RFMOs FAD Working Group, which is programmed to take place in San Diego, California, USA, under the chairmanship of Dr. Josu Santiago.

I would appreciate if you could inform your membership that the Group will meet from 8 to 10 May and remind them that two representatives (a scientist and a manager) from each Developing Member (of one or several tuna RFMOS) with relevant FAD tuna fisheries shall receive the financial support to attend the meeting using funds provided by the European Union.

For the purpose of making the necessary arrangements, the interested members should contact Ms Monica Galvan a mgalvan@iattc.org.

As requested by the Chair of the Group, the following information should also be circulated among your membership.

- <u>Format of the meeting</u>: Excepting the session during which the conclusions and recommendations will be discussed and adopted, the meeting will be held in an informal format in order to make the discussion on technical and scientific issues more open and productive.
- Appointed <u>coordinators</u> will lead the different discussion topics of the agenda. Each coordinator or a designated expert will make a "keynote" presentation in addition to providing in advance a summary document highlighting the major issues with a view at preparing and stimulating the discussion. This document should include a list of references covering all t-RFMOs. A list of "focus questions" will also be developed prior to the meeting and in consultations with the identified participants in the working group to facilitate the discussion.
- In relation to <u>documents and presentations</u>, participants are welcome to submit all documents that they would consider relevant. The chair and the leaders of the discussion topics, in consultation with the identified participants in the working group, will determine which documents are to be presented orally and which precise time slot should be allocated for its presentation.

Guidelines for the authors of documents will be prepared and provided by 15 March at the latest, as well as an online platform for them to submit abstracts. Deadlines for the submission of these documents will be 31 March for titles and abstracts and 30 April for the full documents.

Finally, it would be most appreciated that the attached provisional agenda be also circulated.
