
LANDINGS BY FOREIGN VESSELS IN THE PORTS OF CPCs

This document summarises the information received in accordance with IOTC Resolution 05/03 *Relating to the establishment of an IOTC programme of inspection in port.*

Submission of lists of foreign fishing vessels and their landings for 2008

Paragraph 8. Each CPC shall submit electronically to the Secretary by 1 July of each year, the list of foreign fishing vessels which have landed in their ports tuna and tuna like species caught in the IOTC area in the preceding year. This information shall detail the catch composition by weight and species landed

Information on the status of reporting relating to IOTC Resolution 05/03 for 2008 is given in Table 1.

For 2008, the Secretariat received information from seven CPCs (Comoros, Malaysia, Mauritius, Oman, Seychelles, South Africa and U.K. (I. O. Territories)). All information submitted under the requirements of IOTC Resolution 05/03 was processed by the Secretariat.
