

ANNUAL REPORT OF IMPLEMENTATION TO IOTC

Reporting CPC: BELIZE

Date: 9th February 2010

Part 1 A: Actions taken under national legislation, in 2009 to implement conservation and management measures adopted by the Commission at the last session.

Resolution 09/01: On the performance of review follow-up The content of this resolution is respected.

Resolution 09/02: On the implementation of a limitation of fishing capacity of Contracting Parties and Cooperating non-Contracting Parties.

- In accordance with paragraph 1 of the aforementioned Resolution, please find attached a list of Belize flagged fishing vessels which fished for tropical tunas during 2006 (Attachment 5) and for swordfish and albacore during the year 2007 (Attachment 7).
- In accordance with paragraph 2 of the aforementioned Resolution we confirm that we have verified the effective presence and fishing activities of our vessels in the IPTOC area in 2006 and in 2007 through our VMS records, catch reports, vessel inspections etc.

Resolution 09/03: On establishing a list of vessels presumed to have carried out illegal, unregulated and unreported fishing in the IOTC area.

We have not observed any vessels that have engaged in IUU activities within the IOTC Convention area in 2009 nor have we received any reports of any Belize flagged vessels being engaged in IUU activities within this area.

Resolution 09/04: On a Regional Observer Scheme

Belize already has a collection of qualified flag State observers who will be deployed to our vessels for observer inspection as required and in accordance with the aforementioned Resolution. We also intend to utilize the IOTC's observers as necessary once the contribution factor and procedures for this Scheme has been determined at the upcoming meeting.

Resolution 09/05: To prohibit the use of large-scale driftnets on the high seas in the IOTC area of competence.

In compliance with this resolution, all Belize flagged vessels are prohibited from utilizing large scale driftnets on the high seas in the IOTC area.

Resolution 09/06: On Marine Turtles

In compliance with Resolution 08 /03 and 05/08 "On reducing the incidental by-catch of seabirds in longline fishery and on "Sea Turtles", as advised in our submission dated 23^{rd} April 2009 and Annual Report dated 29^{th} January 2009, Belize issued Fishing Vessel Circular FVC-08/02 in compliance with these two resolution and utilizing the FAO guidelines for Reducing Sea Turtle Mortality in fishing operations. All these measures are in compliance with the requirements of Resolution 09/06.
