

**INDONESIA ANNUAL REPORT TO INDIAN OCEAN TUNA COMMISSION (IOTC)
YEAR 2010**

PART 1 A

ACTION TAKEN, UNDER NATIONAL LEGISLATION

1. Resolution 09/01 concerning Performance Review follow-up.

2. Resolution 09/02 Concerning the Implementation of a limitation of fishing capacity of Contracting Parties and Cooperating Non-Contracting Parties.

A draft of policy concerning a limitation of fishing capacity is being discussed within DGCF and will be continued with MMAF and public consultation, prior to submission to the Ministry Office for approval.

3. Resolution 09/03 Concerning Establishing a list of vessels presumed to have carried out IUU fishing in the IOTC area.

Indonesia acknowledged receipt a letter from the Secretariat on 23 December 2009, informed that one vessel flagged Indonesia; LINGSAR 08, presumed to have fished in the water under the jurisdiction of La Reunion. While we are collecting information on this matter from the owner, Indonesia has submitted a letter to the Secretariat to suggest not putting the vessel on the IOTC provisional IUU Vessels List by this year, as it was proposed by European Union less than 120 days before IOTC Annual Meeting, 1-5 March 2010.

4. Resolution 09/04 Concerning Regional Observer Scheme

We have informed this program to the fishing industry, but we need some time to continue negotiation with them as following this program will be very costly. Indonesia continues to develop a national observer program by keeping conduct training for observer on board.

5. Resolution 09/05 Concerning Prohibition the use of large scale driftnet on the high seas in the IOTC area of competence.

The existing regulation allows the use of large scale gillnet at IEEZ up to 10,000 meters length. But we have reminded the fishing industry on this resolution that the maximum length can be setting out at high seas is 2,500 meters. The national regulation may be reviewed accordingly.

6. Resolution 09/06 Concerning Marine turtles

Indonesia keeps protecting marine turtle from exploitation. We prohibit trade of any part of marine turtle, including protecting their habitat and releasing the turtle baby into the sea as a part of re-stocking action. This action widely promoted and broadcasted all over the country.

7. IOTC Sticker

The Minister of Marine Affairs and Fisheries has officially launched the IOTC sticker program in Bali, 2 January 2010 by affix the sticker to a longline fishing vessel symbolically. Further, the sticker will be distributed to 4 (four) fishing ports in Indonesia with respective indicative number as described in the following table:
