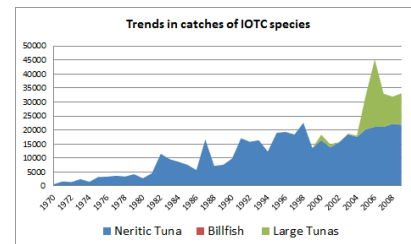

Res. 09/02 and earlier resolutions: On Fleet Development Plan (FDP).	<b>Compliant</b>	Has submitted its FDP in May 2005 and a revised FDP in May 2010. <i>Reported that it could not implement the initial plan.</i>	A new deadline for submission of FDPs and revised FDPs was set for the 31 <sup>st</sup> December 2010; unless the concerned CPCs indicated an earlier deadline.	
3.2. Res. 09/02 and earlier resolutions: On the limitation of fishing capacity.	<b>Compliant</b>	Has reported its list of active vessels targeting tropical tunas during 2006. Has reported Thai vessels are not targeting swordfish and albacore.	CPCs were encouraged to submit the missing information within the shortest possible time.

The Committee expressed great concern about the low levels of compliance of some CPC and urged them to provide the information required within the shortest time possible

Res. 07/02: On the IOTC Record of Vessels Authorised to operate in the IOTC Area.	<b>Partially comply</b>	Currently have 14 fishing vessels. <i>Some mandatory information missing.</i>	The Committee also reiterated the importance of reporting vessel volume as Gross Tonnage (GT) instead of GRT, as GT is the standard measurement of vessel volume, in accordance with Resolution 07/02.	
3.7. Res. 09/03: On establishing a list of vessels presumed to have carried out illegal, unreported and unregulated fishing in the IOTC Area.	<b>Partially comply</b>	Has not provided any information to list vessels on the 2011 Draft IUU Vessels List. None of its vessels have been proposed for the 2011 Draft IUU Vessels List. <i>Has failed to provide their opinion on requests to de-register two vessels listed in the 2010 IOTC IUU Vessels List.</i>		
3.8. Res. 08/02: On a Regional Observer Programme (ROP) to monitor at-sea transhipments.	<b>Compliant</b>	Is participating in the ROP.	All at-sea transhipments should be in conformity with the IOTC regional observer programme for monitoring at-sea transhipments.

The Committee reiterated its concern that many data sets received from Members were incomplete, in particular catch-and-effort and size frequency data. The Committee urged all CPCs to take the necessary steps to meet IOTC fisheries data requirements.

	<b>Non-compliant</b>	Size frequency – Data not submitted. By-catch of sharks – Data not submitted. By-catch of marine turtles – Data not submitted. By-catch of seabirds - Data not submitted.
