



COMPLEMENTARY ELEMENTS FOR DISCUSSION UNDER ITEM 4 OF THE AGENDA FOR THE COMPLIANCE COMMITTEE

Prepared by IOTC Secretariat, 05 SEPTEMBER, 2020

PURPOSE

To bring to the attention of the Compliance Committee the actions undertaken by CPCs during the last intersessional period to address fishing practices that undermines the effectiveness of conservation and management measures of the Indian Ocean Tuna Commission.

INFORMATION REPORTED TO THE IOTC SECRETARIAT

- 1. Information with regards to three Sri Lankan flagged vessels:
 - Attachment 1 Information on the vessel, IMUL-A-0204-MTR (DINESH 03), submitted by the UK ("BIOT") in March 2020.

 - Attachment 3 Information on the vessel, IMUL-A-0063-KMN, submitted by the UK ("BIOT") in July 2020.
- 2. Information with regards to a vessel flagged to Taiwan, Province of China:
 - Attachment 4 Information on the vessel, YONG QING FA No. 666, submitted by South Africa in August 2020.

RECOMMENDATION/S

That the CoC17:

- 1) **NOTE** paper IOTC–2020–CoC17–07a, which describes four incidences of illegal fishing activities that took place in the waters of the two CPCs, within the IOTC Area.
- 2) NOTE the actions that Sri Lanka and Taiwan, Province of China, have taken against the vessels involved in these incidences.
- 3) **NOTE** the effectiveness of the bilateral relationship established between Sri Lanka and the UK ("BIOT") with the objective of combatting IUU fishing activities.
- 4) **RECOMMEND** that South Africa keep CPCs informed on the progress and outcome of the criminal proceedings against the owner and/or master of the vessel.
- 5) **RECOMMEND** that Taiwan, Province of China, cooperate with the authorities of South Africa by providing information that will assist the latter in this criminal investigation.
- 6) **RECOMMEND** that Taiwan, Province of China, provide information to the Compliance Committee on the timeframe and nature of the violation that was committed under its legal framework.
- 7) **RECOMMEND** that CPCs continue to provide the Compliance Committee with information of actions they undertake to combat fishing practices that undermines the effectiveness of conservation and management measures adopted by the Indian Ocean Tuna Commission.

Resolution 18/03 On establishing a list of vessels presumed to have carried out IUU fishing in the IOTC Area of Competence: Sri Lankan Flagged vessel IMULA 0204 MTR (Dinesh 3)

As required in paragraphs 5 and 6 of Resolution 18/03 please find attached a completed IOTC Reporting form for Illegal Activity and accompanying correspondence with Sri Lanka for the Sri Lankan flagged vessel IMULA 0204 MTR (Dinesh 3). Under the bilateral arrangement established between UKOT and Sri Lanka in order to combat IUU, this vessel was reported to the Sri Lankan Authorities who have taken action against the owner under the provisions of national fisheries legislation (FARA 1996/2016).

We are satisfied that sanctions of adequate severity have been taken by the flag State in respect of the owner of this vessel. We note that the vessel has been released on the condition that it undertakes no high seas fishing and that it is prioritised for installation of VMS. We request that the Sri Lankan Authorities report to the Compliance Committee when installation of the VMS occurs.

We consider the actions taken in respect of the skipper to be inadequate but note that such administrative powers that are currently available to deal with the skippers of IUU vessels have been applied. We note the intention of Sri Lanka to update its Fisheries Act in respect of the sanctions available to it against vessel operators (skippers).

Noting the effective bilateral relationship established with Sri Lanka, and their firm and demonstrated commitment to combat IUU perpetrated by vessels flagged to Sri Lanka we recommend '(b) Notification of illegal activity to IOTC Secretariat. Recommend notification of activity to flag State'.

5 fresh YFT in hold forward of this wrapped in hessian, one smaller tuna, species unknown.

Comments: 5 large YFT tuna stowed in 'cold store' in front of iced hold. 2 wrapped in hessian and 3 hidden under food stores along with a smaller tuna species (no ID). YFT was lifted onto deck by crew and examined by SFPO and James, due to looking very fresh. Blood poured from the fish when brought to deck. Gills were bright red, blood bright red, pec fins cut and tail fins, both red with fresh blood. Eyes were transparent, black pupil and soft but firm to touch, pigment of skin was bright and no change from original colour. Hole from hook in the mouth visible. Fish was clearly caught within the last few hours.

Large hook used to lift tuna from hold, but none other seen.

Tools on green padding of 2nd hold cover as soon as vessel was boarded. Next to hooks and line on

deck. Hook/line barrels next to shooting reel on SB side.

Line/hooks were not wet however, very possible for any gear to be cut immediately without evidence.

Comments: During inspection of the vessel, crew on BPV noted 2 white floats in the water (no images) in a very close location to where the vessel was first sighted. A position was logged by 2/o on bridge of BPV. The floats were 200-250m apart, floats passed close to portside of BPV, no other descriptions were noted.

SFPO and boat crew returned to BPV, IOTC register checked and information exchanged. Fishing vessel was then boarded for a second time. Skipper had previously admitted gear was in the water but was '71 miles away' to the west.

On second boarding skipper was asked about gear that was found by BPV and SFPO asked for the position to be put into his plotter. He denied this was his gear after being asked several times, told the gear was in almost the same position as his prior to changing heading and increasing his vessel speed. SFPO asked skipper to take the vessel to the floats and to recover them, but he continued to deny they were his. Before departed skipper was given one last chance to recover gear stating that SFPO needed to recover the gear and if he did not and it was his he would not get it back. He still denied ownership.

Request for Confirmation of Ownership of the Sri Lankan vessel IMUL-A-0207-MTR (note, on some paperwork the number is IMUL-A-0204-MTR).

The Sri Lankan flagged vessel **DINESH 3 IMUL-A-0207-MTR**, (IOTC0011402 (current authorisation expired 11/08/2015)) is currently the subject of a criminal investigation into suspected fishing activities. In order to complete the investigation, the BIOT Administration needs to be clear as to the accurate details of the registered owner before a final decision on any course of action can be taken. At this stage our investigations into the possible activities of this vessel are preliminary, no finding has been made by the Administration of any such activity.

According to the best information available to the Administration the owner's name and address are as follows;

Please can you confirm the ownership details for the vessel? We would be grateful for a formal signed response with a DFAR letterhead, which can be scanned and sent by email as soon as possible.

There was no VMS unit visible onboard, the captain also stated the vessel did not possess one. However, in case this is not the case, please could you supply any VMS records for the recent trip that could provide information in relation to the vessel's movements. It is predicted that the vessel will arrive in Diego Garcia 19/06/2019.

This vessel may be operating as part of a group who are involved in IUU fishing activity. It may be that it is already known to you and is a subject of interest either alone or as a result of it operating with others. We would be grateful for an early indication of whether you plan to request that Sri Lankan authorities deal with the vessel if it is confirmed that it is in violation of the fisheries regulations of Sri Lanka.

This is reference to your letter dated 17/06/2019 requesting confirmation of the ownership details of the Sri Lankan flagged vessel which is currently under criminal investigation into suspected fishing activities in the BIOT/UKOT waters.

I would like to confirm that the exact registration number you are referring is IMUL-A-0204-MTR and the details of the owner is as follows. Further I would like to ensure that IMUL-A-0207- MTR is currently anchored in the fishery harbor Devinuwara in Sri Lanka.

The owner has been permitted to operate only within the EEZ of Sri Lanka. But however it is obvious that he has violated the law. Sri Lanka has legal provisions to take legal actions for such violations under the FARA No. 02 of 1996 and the amendments. With regard to the VMS information, as this vessel has been permitted to operate only within the EEZ of Sri Lanka, the VMS is not mandatory equipment at the point of departure of such vessel.

Therefore we much appreciate if you could send the vessel and the crew on board to Sri Lanka with your investigation reports and proven documents enabling this Department to proceed ahead on this matter.

Your continuous support of providing information on the vessels of Sri Lanka those engage in illegal fishing activities in BIOT/UKOT waters is encouraged.

Release of the Sri Lankan Fishing Vessel Dinesh 3 (IMUL-A-0204-MTR).

Thank you for your letter dated 18th June 2019 confirming the ownership and licensing details of the above referenced vessel.

The vessel had not filed a transit report to the British Indian Ocean Territory (BIOT) Administration.

The vessel was seen within the BIOT Marine Protected Area (MPA) which prohibits any commercial fishing. The speed and movement of the vessel was considered suspicious and so the vessel boarded and inspected on 15 June 2019 by the BIOT Senior Fisheries Protection Officer (SFPO).

During inspection, the vessel was found to have tuna products on board, the SFPO found five yellowfin tuna that appeared to have been freshly caught as, amongst other things, they were still bleeding and the gills were bright blood red. No record of the vessel could be found on the IOTC Record of Authorised Vessels, nor did it have VMS on board. There was unmarked fishing gear onboard, some of which was not properly stowed. The vessel did have a logbook onboard but there were no entries recorded in it since 23rd March 2019. The vessel did not have a flag state license for operating in the high seas.

The vessel was required to go to Diego Garcia to enable the authorities to carry out a full investigation into its activities. It arrived in Diego on the 19th June and was subjected to a police investigation. At the end of the investigation the Master and vessel were released. The Master was advised that, whilst no criminal proceedings would be brought against him in BIOT, the above information would be passed to DFAR and they would be likely to take such action as you would consider appropriate in the circumstances.

The vessel was escorted from Diego Garcia on 20 June 2019 at 12:58 and the Master estimated that it would take 11-12 days to return to Sri Lanka

We would like to request that, DFAR take such action as they can against the owner / Master/ of this vessel so as to encourage him and others to act in compliance with both IOTC CMMs and obligations under flag state laws.

This is to inform you that entering into other state's Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) without valid license and fishing inside is a serious offence. According to the Indian Ocean Tuna Commission (IOTC) Resolution 18/03, once the vessel found guilty on theses offences it will be included into Illegal, Unreported and Unregulated (IUU) list.

Such vessels will subject to,

- · Cancellation of vessel registration and suspension of fishing operation license
- · Litigation against vessel owner and skipper
- · Prohibition of exportation of fish caught by the vessel.

Further, I would like to inform you that listing of Sri Lankan fishing vessels in the IOTC IUU vessels list caused damage to the fisheries industry in Sri Lanka.

As required in paragraphs 5 and 6 of Resolution 18/03 please find attached a completed IOTC Reporting form for Illegal Activity and accompanying evidence supporting IUU fishing activity for the Sri Lankan flagged vessel IMUL-A-0063-KMN. Under the bilateral arrangement established between UKOT and Sri Lanka in order to combat IUU, this vessel was reported to the Sri Lankan Authorities who have taken action against the owner/master under the provisions of national fisheries legislation (FARA 1996/2013).

The attached evidence shows that:

- The vessel was on the current IOTC Record of Authorised Vessels
- The vessel was fishing without a licence in BIOT waters on 17 June 2020.
- The catch included tuna and tuna like species
- Due to the current situation with Coronavirus the vessel was not boarded and the BIOT Authorities were unable to conduct a full criminal investigation of the vessel's activity; Sri Lanka was requested to investigate the vessel.
- Sri Lanka has detained the vessel in port under a SLR5 millions bond, suspended the fishing operation licence, skipper licence and seized the registration and log books.
- A trial date has been set for 20 October 2020 which is after the Compliance Committee Meeting.

By copy of this letter, we request that in advance of the Compliance Committee meeting Sri Lanka confirm that this vessel remains detained in port.

We submit this vessel to IOTC Compliance Committee with recommendation b) '*Notification of illegal activity to IOTC Secretariat. Recommend notification of activity to flag State*.'. This recommendation is made noting that the vessel is detained in port under bond and the owner will be tried in October 2020. We reserve the right to resubmit this vessel in 2021 if sanctions of adequate severity are not applied.

Report on the inspection and illegal fishing activity of the Sri Lankan vessel IMUL-A-0063-KMN in British Indian Ocean Territory (BIOT) Waters

The Sri Lankan flagged vessel IMUL-A-0063-KMN was inspected on suspicion of being involved in illegal activities, namely illegal fishing in BIOT waters on 17 June 2020. The vessel was on the IOTC list of Authorised Fishing Vessels (expiry date 30 June 2020). The vessel was observed hauling fishing gear (long lines) within BIOT waters. The catch included tuna and tuna like species. The vessel was fishing illegally without a licence within BIOT waters and was ordered to release the catch, dead or alive, and was then escorted out of the Territory. The vessel inspection report is attached.

Due to the current situation with Coronavirus the vessel was not boarded and we are therefore unable to conduct a full criminal investigation of the vessel's activity. The Master was instructed to leave BIOT waters directly and to return the fishing vessel to port.

The vessel is now on its way back to Sri Lanka and should arrive in the next few days. In respect of our bilateral cooperation to combat illegal fishing we would kindly request the assistance of DFAR to recall the vessel to port immediately and notify the relevant port authorities to detain the vessel on arrival pending investigation. We would be grateful if you could conduct a regulatory investigation into the activities of this vessel, including its vessel monitoring system (VMS) data. Following your investigation, we would also be grateful for an early indication of any legal action against the owner and Master (skipper) of the vessel that you plan to implement through the Sri Lankan authorities.

The activities of this vessel and any subsequent action taken by the Sri Lankan Authorities will be submitted to the 17th Compliance Committee before the (new) 70 day deadline of 27 July.

Further, I would like to inform you that listing of Sri Lankan fishing vessels in the IOTC IUU vessels list caused damage to the fisheries industry in Sri Lanka.

Detention of the Fishing Vessel, Yong Qing Fa No. 666

The South African Department of Agriculture, Forestry & Fisheries (DAFF) received a request from the Government of Taiwan, through the Taiwanese Fisheries Agency, seeking assistance regarding detention of the fishing vessel, Yong Qing Fa No. 666. The Department of Agriculture, Forestry & Fisheries was informed that the vessel has transgressed Taiwanese domestic legislation. The vessel is currently anchored within the South African Exclusive Economic Zone, outside of the Cape Town Port, and is off port limits. In accordance with South Africa's domestic legislation, the vessel cannot be detained, unless it is in the Port.

It is in this regard that the Department of International Relations and Cooperation (DIRCO) seeks the assistance of the Government of Taiwan with the following, in order to proceed:

- 1. Appointment of a Shipping Agency in South Africa to facilitate, the berthing and carrying of any cost implication from Port Authority and any other cost that will be incurred relating to but not limited to application of applicable permits, wrt the stay of the vessel.
- 2. Taiwanese Government to ensure that the crew will be sent back to Taiwan and that the Taiwanese Government will bear all costs relating to this.
- 3. While the vessel is in Port, the Taiwanese Government to appoint a Security company to secure the vessel.
- 4. All paper work of the vessel to be presented to the Department of Agriculture, Forestry & Fisheries, including the Owner details and the current flag of the vessel, including all licences and permits issued to the vessel (if any) as well as authorised Area of fishing.
- 5. Taiwanese Government to provide food and any health insurance to the crew and the Captain while the vessel is in South Africa.

TAKE NOTICE THAT Buyekezwa Polo, a duly authorised fishery control officer has reasonable grounds:

1. To believe that the vessel YONG QING FA NO. 666 ("the vessel"), the vessel owner, Master and Chief Engineer have been used in the commission of one or more than one offences in terms of the Marine Living Resources Act No 18 of 1998 ("the Act") section 13 (1) read with regulation 11 of the Act and also Contravened Port State Measure Agreement paragraph. Offences in terms of the Marine Living Resources Act No 18 of 1998 ("the Act") namely:

1.1 The Master of the vessel contravened of section 13 (1) by not having permit to enter Economic Exclusive Zone of South Africa with a permit, Section 13 (1) state that No person shall exercise any right granted in terms of the section 18 or perform any other activity in terms of this Act unless a permit has been issued by the Minister to such person to exercise that right or perform that activity.

Furthermore the Master and the Vessel Owner Contravened Marine Living Resource Act 18/1998 Regulation 80 (1) (b) by not having up-to-date certified drawings or description of the layout of the fishing vessel, and in particular the number of fish holds of the fishing vessel, with their storage capacity expressed in cubic metres;

5. Furthermore the Master and the Vessel Owner Contravened Marine Living Resource Act 18/1998 Regulation 80 (1) (e) by not having the original of the licence or permit issued in respect of the fishing vessel, which shall at all times be kept in place where it can be readily examined and where it is protected from damage.

- The subject fishing vessel arrived under own power in the Port of Cape Town at about 09h30 on the 30/11/2019, maintaining VHF radio silence and her Automatic Identification System not reflecting. She was docked when it became apparent that the owners were unreachable and this matter was becoming both a humanitarian, safety and an environmental risk. She was docked at berth Eastern Mole 1 at about 10h35 on the 13/12/2019.
- 2. She contravened the following sections of the Port Rules of the Republic of South Africa, namely:
 - a. Part B This section relates to the regulation and control of navigation in the approaches to a port.
 - b. Part C This section relates to the requirements for entering a port.
- She is still in contravention of section 114 of the Port Rules of the Republic of South Africa which states, "Every owner of a vessel intending to enter a port in the Republic must appoint a vessel agent, unless the Authority grants an exemption to a vessel".
- 4. The Transnet National Ports Authority has already incurred costs in respect of port and berth dues, marine services related to subject vessel.
- 5. The Harbour Master's office has safety and environmental concerns regarding subject vessel. These concerns relate to the seaworthiness of the vessel.
- 6. The Harbour Master reserves her rights in terms of section 74 of the Port Rules of the Republic South Africa which states, "Despite the provisions of any other rule, the Harbour Master may, in the interests of the safety of the port, the persons, vessels and other property in it, issue instructions that safety precautions be taken, or take emergency measures that the Harbour Master believes are necessary and appropriate".
