FEEDBACK REGARDING COMPLIANCE ISSUES

China

SUBJECT: Outstanding compliance issues


During the 17th Session of the IOTC Compliance Committee, held on the 01 and 02 October 2020, by correspondence, Contracting Parties and Cooperating non-Contracting Parties (CPCs) were individually assessed for their respective compliance with IOTC Conservation and Management Measures and their reporting requirements. Based on the examination of the Country Reports on Compliance, the National Reports of Implementation and the reports of the Scientific Committee, the Compliance Committee noted some variation in the degree of compliance by the CPCs.

As agreed by the 16th Session of the Commission, the Chair of the Commission is required to distribute “Letters of Feedback” to relevant CPCs, highlighting areas of non-compliance.

Specifically, the Compliance Committee noted the following compliance issues presented in annex in respect of **China**.

The CoC ACKNOWLEDGED the difficulties that China continue to face to fully implement the following CMMs adopted by the Commission:	Response
• Has not provided the report on zero catches matrix, as required by Resolution 18/07.	To improve this issue, we re-submitted the data again last year before the CoC meeting.
• Has not provided information on actions taken domestically to monitor catches & manage fisheries of Striped Marlin, Black Marlin, Blue Marlin and Indo-pacific Sailfish, as required by Resolution 18/05.	China government is currently updating the management legal document, but the final edition is still under signing by the Ministry.
