The CoC ACKNOWLEDGED the difficulties that Comoros continue to face to fully implement the following CMMs adopted by the Commission:	Response
 Has not transposed the ban on oceanic whitetip sharks into national legislation, as required by Resolution 13/06. 	A Decree is under signature.
 Has reported size frequency statistics for coastal fisheries not to IOTC standards (less than 1 fish per metric ton for some species/gears), as required by Resolution 15/02 	Comoros have made efforts to improve the data collection scheme to be able to comply with IOTC requirements.
 Has not transposed the prohibition of intentionally setting any gear type on mobulid rays into national legislation, as required by Resolution 19/03. 	A Decree is under signature.
 Has reported size frequency statistics not to IOTC standards for sharks (less than 1 fish per metric ton) for some species/gears, as required by Resolution 17/05. 	Comoros have made efforts to improve the data collection scheme to be able to comply with IOTC requirements.
 Has not provided data on interactions with marine turtles as required by Resolution 12/04 	The report on marine turtles was provided to the IOTC.
Has not provided information on actions taken domestically to monitor catches of Blue Shark as required by Resolution 18/02	The report on catch statistics for sharks was provided to the IOTC.
 Has not provided information on actions taken domestically to monitor catches & manage fisheries of Striped Marlin, Black Marlin, Blue Marlin and Indo-pacific Sailfish as required by Resolution 18/05. 	The report on catch statistics for marlins was provided to the IOTC.
• Has not transposed the prohibition to retain on board, tranship, land, any Striped Marlin, Black Marlin, Blue Marlin, Indo-pacific Sailfish smaller than 60 cm Lower Jaw Fork Length into national legislation as required by Resolution 18/05.	The implementation of this measure is very difficult with artisanal fishery using vessels 6-9 meters in length.
