RE: Request for Continued Participation as Cooperating Non-Contracting Party (CNCP)

Dear Mr. O'Brien/Secretariat:

The purpose of this letter is to request Liberia's reinstatement as a CNCP of the IOTC. Please note that our reason for requesting reinstatement of our status is because Liberia has a number of reefer/carrier and support vessels that may participate in transshipment activities in the IOTC Convention Area. Pursuant to Resolution 03/02, please see below information:

Data on historical fisheries in the IOTC Area, including nominal catches, number/type of vessels, name of fishing vessels, fishing effort and fishing areas:

Liberia has several reefer/carrier and support vessels that may wish to carry out transshipment activities in the IOTC Convention Area.

In the past, Liberia submitted and will continue to submit the requisite data to the IOTC.

Details on current fishing presence in the IOTC Area, number of vessels and vessel characteristics:

Liberia does not have fishing vessels in the IOTC Convention Area.

Liberia has not conducted any research programs in the IOTC Area. Should Liberia conduct any such activities, the results will be provided to the Secretariat.

In addition, Liberia:

Confirms its commitment to respect the Commission's Conservation and Management Measures (CMMs):

Liberia is fully committed to cooperating in the implementation of CMMs adopted by the IOTC and will continue to ensure that its vessels comply with the provisions of the IOTC Convention and CMMs.

f) Inform the IOTC of the measures to ensure compliance by Liberian registered vessels:

Liberia has implemented measures to ensure compliance by vessels engaged in transshipment activities. Some of those measures include, but are not limited to: vessel monitoring system (VMS) requirements; authorization to transship; establishment of a fish monitoring center (FMC); establishing a list of vessels presumed to have carried out IUU fishing activities; and investigation of alleged IUU activities and imposition of sanctions. In conclusion, Liberia hereby makes an explicit commitment to attend all compliance, technical and commission meetings in adherence to the IOTC rules and procedures.
