SUMMARY REPORT ON POSSIBLE INFRACTIONS OBSERVED UNDER THE REGIONAL OBSERVER PROGRAMME

Prepared by IOTC Secretariat, 23 April 2022

PURPOSE

In line with the requirement of IOTC Resolution 21/02 *On establishing a programme for transhipment by large-scale fishing vessels*, this document provides information on possible infractions, as recorded by observers deployed under the Programme during 2021, that have not been disposed of (Appendix I) by the Working Party on the Implementation of Conservation and Management measures (WPICMM) due to, additional clarifications required or that response was not provided by the concerned fleet.

BACKGROUND

The Sixteenth Session of the Compliance Committee (CoC16) made the following recommendation, which is in line with Activity 10.1.3 of the work plan of the Working Party on the Implementation of Conservation and Management measures (WPICMM):

Notwithstanding the timing of the WPICMM meeting and the deadline for responses, the CoC **RECOMMENDED** that the responses to the possible infractions be analyse by the IOTC Secretariat, CoC16.08 (Para 31).

The above recommendation required that part of the procedure provided for in paragraph 26 of Resolution 19/06 be suspended. Therefore, the IOTC Secretariat provided the 2021 list of possible infractions reported up to the 31st of December 2021, in order to receive the results of the investigations by 15th January 2022, from the concerned fleets. This change in procedure was required in order to meet with the requirements for the IOTC Secretariat to perform the analyses of responses and to make the results of the assessment available to the fifth meeting of the WPICMM, which was held in mid-February 2022. DISCUSSION

In summary, up to the 31st December 2021¹, a total of 10 possible infractions were recorded (2020: 59; 2019: 178), of which:

- 3 related to fishing logbook (2020: 20; 2019: 33),
- 4 related to marking of vessels (2020: 19; 2019: 51),
- 3 related to ATF (2020: 20; 2019: 22),

These were communicated to the concerned fleets participating in the Programme, as and when the concerned deployment reports were approved by the IOTC Secretariat.

Of the 10 possible infractions notified to the participating fleets, 10 responses were received (Table 1). Three fleets, China, Oman and Taiwan, Province of China, have provided their responses before the deadline of 15th January 2022, and the fleet of Seychelles has provided the responses for the cases observed after the deadline of 15th January2022. The responses are provided in paper <u>IOTC-2022-WPICMM05-04_Add2</u>.

¹ <u>Note</u> observer deployment was suspended in March 2020 (Circular 2020-14) and a limited number of observers were deployed in 2021, due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Consequently, the number of possible infractions may not be reflective of what would be detected in a "normal" observed year.

The assessments made by the IOTC Secretariat were endorsed by the WPICMM05 for 9 responses. These were assessed as "appropriate action taken by the fleet", thus no recommendation for further action by the CoC are required. For one response, which concerns one LSTLV, the WPICMM05 recommended that the concerned fleet provide further evidence for discussion at CoC19.

The LSTLV for which further evidence was to be provided is presented below:
