IDENTIFICATION OF REPEATED INFRINGEMENTS UNDER THE REGIONAL OBSERVER PROGRAMME

Prepared by IOTC Secretariat, 27 January 2023

In line with 1) the requirement of IOTC Resolution 22/02 *On establishing a programme for transhipment by large-scale fishing vessels*, 2) the recommendation made by the Compliance Committee (CoC) at its 10th Session:

<u>IOTC-2013-CoC10-R</u> Paragraph 53: The CoC **RECOMMENDED** that the Secretariat follow, from one year to the next, the potential infringement cases identified so as to allow the CoC to identify repeated cases of infringement.

In line with the recommendation made by the Working Party on Implementation of Conservation and Management Measures at its 4th Session:

<u>IOTC-2021-WPICMM04-R</u> Paragraph 21: The WPICMM04 **RECOMMENDED** that the IOTC Secretariat prepare a paper on repeated possible infractions to the next WPICMM.

This document provides a summary of repeated cases of potential infringements of IOTC Resolutions by large-scale tuna longline vessels (LSTLVs) and carrier vessels, as recorded by observers deployed under the at-sea Transhipment Programme during 2022.

Identification of possible repeated infringements by LSTLVs in 2022.

From the seven (7) fleets which have transhipped in 2022, five (5) fleets, China, Taiwan, Province of China, Malaysia, Mauritius and Seychelles, have vessels with repeated possible infringements in ROP 2022.

The list of LSTLVs with repeated potential infringements in 2022 is presented and summarized by category of possible infraction, and by fleet, in Appendix I.

Identification of repeated possible infringements by LSTLVs in 2022 that have a record of possible infringement in 2021.

Two (2) fleets, China and Taiwan, Province of China, have one LSTLV each with a record of repeated possible infringements in 2022 that have one or more records of possible infringements in 2021.

The list of LSTLVs with repeated potential infringements in 2022 and record of potential infringements in 2021 is presented and summarized by category of possible infraction, and by fleet, in Appendix I.

RECOMMENDATION/S

That the WPICMM06:

- 1) **NOTE** paper IOTC–2023–WPICMM06–04_Add1, which describe and identify possible repeated infringements under the at-sea transhipments programme in 2022,
- 2) **NOTE** that two (2) fleets, China and Taiwan, Province of China, have one LSTLV each with a record of repeated possible infringements in 2022 that have one or more records of possible infringements in 2021.
- 3) **NOTE** that five (5) fleets, China, Taiwan, Province of China, Malaysia, Mauritius and Seychelles, have occurrence of possible repeated infringements in 2022 and have no record of possible infringement in the ROP 2021.
