PROGRESS ON REQUESTS FOR ACTION MADE BY THE COMMISSION IN 2022

PREPARED BY: SECRETARIAT

PURPOSE

To provide the Commission with an opportunity to consider the progress made during the inter-sessional period on its requests for action made to the Secretariat during the 26th Session in 2022.

BACKGROUND

In 2022, the Commission made 15 requests for action. To-date 7 of those requests have been completed and 6 are ongoing and 2 have not been completed. The requests are listed below.

In accordance with Rule IX.1 of the IOTC Rules of Procedure there is a standing requirement for the Chairperson, each year, to send a letter to all non-contracting parties known to be fishing for IOTC species urging them to become a CPC. In 2023, letters were sent to 9 non-member coastal states.

Regarding requests from other bodies that were endorsed by the Commission in 2022:

- 6 requests for action were from the Standing Committee on Administration and Finance 6 have been completed (IOTC-2023-SCAF20-03).
- 13 requests for action were from the Compliance Committee 12 have been completed, 1 is ongoing (IOTC-2023-CoC20-14).

That the Commission:
