INFORMATION RELATED TO PRESUMED IUU FISHING ACTIVITIES

Prepared by IOTC Secretariat, 13 April 2023

PURPOSE

To bring to the attention of the Compliance Committee information received from Panama regarding the vessels HONGDONGFISHERY12 and LEXMAR009, previously registered in Panama, and actions undertaken by CPCs during the intersessional period to address fishing practices or activities that presumably undermines the effectiveness of conservation and management measures adopted by the Indian Ocean Tuna Commission.

INFORMATION REPORTED TO THE IOTC SECRETARIAT

- 1. Information with regards to two vessels previously flagged to Panama, and reported by France (OT) to the IOTC Compliance Committee (CoC19) via document <u>IOTC-2022-CoC19-07d Rev1</u>, in April 2022.
 - <u>Attachment 1</u> Information on the vessels HONGDONGFISHERY12 and LEXMAR009.
- 2. Information with regards to five Sri Lankan flag vessels, reported by the United Kingdom in March 2023. The attachments also contain information provided by Sri Lanka in regard to actions taken against the vessel owners/masters.

RECOMMENDATION/S

That the CoC19:

- 1) **NOTE** paper IOTC-2023-CoC20-08, which provides additional contexts to the activities of the two vessels previously flagged to Panama in the waters of France (OT), and which also describes several incidences of alleged illegal fishing activities that took place in the IOTC Area.
- 2) **NOTE** the actions that Sri Lanka has taken against the owners/masters of the vessels involved in these incidences.
- 3) **NOTE** that India has not provided any information to the IOTC Secretariat on the incidence related to the IUU listed vessel IND-TN-15-MM-9070 (AVE MARIYA).
- 4) RECOMMEND that India provide the Compliance Committee with information on actions that it has initiated against the owner/master of the IUU listed vessel IND-TN-15-MM-9070 (AVE MARIYA) since its inclusion in the IOTC IUU List in May 2022 and actions that it has taken since the IOTC Secretariat notified it of the vessels continued involvement in illegal fishing practices in the IOTC Area.
- 5) **RECOMMEND** that Sri Lanka keep CPCs informed on the progress and outcome of the proceedings against the owner/master of the five Sri Lankan vessels listed in this document.
- 6) **RECOMMEND** that CPCs continue to provide the Compliance Committee with information on actions they undertake to combat fishing practices that undermines the effectiveness of conservation and management measures adopted by the Indian Ocean Tuna Commission.

The Aquatic Resources Authority of Panama, the competent authority for the management and administration of marine resources in our country, hereby respectfully addresses you on this occasion, in accordance with the provisions of Resolution 18/03 on establishing a list of vessels presumed to have carried out illegal, unreported and unregulated fishing in the IOTC area of competence, after the allegations that the vessels LEX MAR 009, IMO 9949819 and HONGDONG FISHERY-WKP-12, IMO 9949821, were possibly involved in illegal fishing practices in the EEZ of France (Juan de Nova) while they belonged to the Panamanian flag; regarding these allegations we proceed to communicate that:

- On 13-Sep-2021 LEX MAR 009, IMO 9949819 and HONGDONG FISHERY-WKP-12, IMO 9949821, both under ownership of WANGFESTAO-KP-PRESTAÇAO DE SERVIÇOS, LDA as newbuilding vessels applied before this Authority for an authorization to obtain an interim flag registry for delivery voyage of both vessels from National Shipbuilding Co., Ltd, Rizhao, China to Luanda, Angola, without fishing gear.
- After the application procedure according to the internal regulations, on 28-Sep-2021 the Letter of No Objection DCI-ARAP-206-2021 and DCI-ARAP-207-2021 were granted in favor of LEX MAR 009 and HONGDONG FISHERY-WKP-12 respectively, and proceeded to obtain the interim flag registry of the vessels under the Panamanian flag before our Maritime Authority.
- The Panama Maritime Authority made both registrations official by issuing navigation special registry documents D-1992-3518-PEXT to LEX MAR 009 and D-1992-3517-PEXT to HONGDONG FISHERY-WKP-12, both under the objective of voyage by delivery, with validity of 3 months effective from September 30, 2021 to December 29, 2021, (See Annex 1-6).
- On 7-Mar-2022, a communication was received by this Authority from the IOTC which indicated that based on paragraph 5 of Res. 18/03, at 13:48 UTC on December 13, 2021, at coordinates 16°06' S 42°01' E in Juan de Nova, French EEZ there was an aerial sighting of the vessels without prior notification of entry and without reporting the quantity of fish on board, that they attempted communication on VHF 16, without obtaining a response from the crew on board, that the infraction was recorded and that additionally a notification was issued and submitted to the French judicial authorities.

This Authority proceeded.

- This Authority proceeded to the pertinent investigations resulting that during the delivery voyage from Rizhao, China to Luanda, Angola, the vessels sailed the Mozambique Channel, the shipowner stated that they accidentally sailed inside the French EEZ trying to avoid the strong winds because the vessel HONGDONG FISHERY-WKP-12 had an overheating of its main engine, according to the logbook (See Annex 4-5), so both vessels decided to stop for about 40 minutes to cool down the engine and continue sailing with the objective of arriving at the port of Inhambane, Mozambique from which they obtained a sailing departure document, (See Annex 7-8), finally arriving in Angola on December 31, 2021.
- The vessels were not equipped with fishing gear; according to a review of the tracking and positions of the encounter between the two vessels, no illegal fishing activities were registered within the French EEZ.
- After the expiration of both navigation interim registry documents, the mentioned vessels ceased to belong to the Panamanian flag.

Based on the foregoing, we submit this information for the IOTC Commission consideration, we remain at your disposal in the event of requiring any additional information that deemed necessary to cooperate with the IOTC conservation and management measures.

I take the opportunity to reiterate to the Commission our highest consideration and respect.

The two fishing vessels were not equipped with any net fishing gear and did not engage in illegal fishing activities. The vessel HONGDONG FISHERY- WKP -12 sailed at 12:15 on 13 December 2021 due to excessively high temperature (83 degrees) of the main engine in JUAN DE NAVA ez-france 16.06, s-42.01,EAt 12:55, the vessel stopped to clean the cooler and left. The vessel stayed for 40 minutes while LEX MAR009 waited and left at the same time.

Thank you for your information and we have conducted an investigation based on the information provided with the document IOTC-2023-CoC20-08 and other sources.

According to our investigation, the two vessels mentioned are neither in our authorized vessel list nor in the IOTC AFV, although the vessels were built in China.

The owner WANGFESTAO-KP-PRESTACAO DE SERVICOS is not a Chinese fisheries company, so Chinese government has no obligation and rights to put it under surveillance.

We acknowledged the explanations given from Panama Authority as in the document IOTC-2023-CoC20-08; however, according to our investigation, these 2 vessels didn't flag to China.

We appreciate the Secretariat for the efforts in the investigation and will be ready to help.

Resolution 18/03 On establishing a list of vessels presumed to have carried out IUU fishing in the IOTC Area of Competence: Three Sri Lankan flagged vessels IMULA0680CHW (Subashi Duwa); IMULA1853MTR; and Subashi Duwa 1

As required in paragraphs 5 and 6 of Resolution 18/03 please find attached completed IOTC Reporting Forms for Illegal Activity and accompanying evidence supporting: IUU fishing activity in BIOT waters; fishing contrary to IOTC Conservation Management Measures for the Sri Lankan flagged vessels IMULA0680CHW (Subashi Duwa) and IMULA1853MTR. A Reporting form for Subashi Duwa 1 is also attached. Under the bilateral arrangement established between UK and Sri Lanka in order to combat IUU, these vessels were reported to the Sri Lankan Authorities with a request that they investigate the activities of the vessels, share details of their movements in BIOT waters from their Vessel Monitoring Systems and take appropriate action against the owner/master under the provisions of national fisheries legislation (FARA 1996/2013).

The attached evidence shows that:

- The vessels IMULA0680CHW (Subashi Duwa) and IMULA1853MTR were on the IOTC Record of Authorised Vessels (RAV), number 16008 authorised until 14 December 2022; and number 1755 and authorised until 28 April 2023, respectively.
- The authorisation details for Subashi Duwa 1 are unknown
- These vessels were recorded from a military vessel in BIOT waters and reported to the Senior Fisheries Protection Officer on 05 July 2022. IMULA0680CHW (Subashi Duwa) was observed to be fishing illegally without a licence within BIOT waters it had four nets in the water at the time of observation. IMULA1853MTR was observed to be fishing illegally without a licence within BIOT waters it had several nets in the water at the time of observation. No direct evidence of IUU was observed for Subashi Duwa 1.
- UK reported these vessels to Sri Lanka on 07 July 2022. Sri Lanka confirmed the vessels IMULA0680CHW (Subashi Duwa) and IMULA1853MTR were authorised to fish on the high seas; indicated that there was insufficient evidence to file a court case; and, both vessels have had a new VMS installed. No details were provided for Subashi Duwa 1

We submit these vessels to the IOTC Compliance Committee with the recommendation 'a) Notification to IOTC Secretariat only. No further action is recommended'. This recommendation is made in light of the fact that UK did not undertake a formal boarding and there was no formal Inspection Report for any of the vessels. However, UK would like to draw the following to the attention of the Compliance Committee:

- No detailed evidence of any investigation into the activities of these vessels was provided to UK, simply the minimal information provided in Appendix II of the IOTC Reporting Form for Illegal Activity. Given that two of the vessels were observed with multiple nets in the water we consider this to be an inadequate response.
- Two vessels were on the IOTC RAV and therefore should have a functioning VMS on board - it appears they did not and Sri Lanka has replaced the VMS units. These represent two more in a number of cases noted by UK where Sri Lanka's Monitoring Control and Surveillance and VMS appear not to be functioning. No VMS details were provided to the UK. UK requests, but rarely receives any VMS details from Sri Lanka in respect of its vessels' activities in BIOT waters.

We invite Sri Lanka to explain how an authorised vessel is able to leave port without a functioning VMS and if it failed during the trip, why it had not been recalled to port sooner. We further invite Sri Lanka to explain to the Compliance Committee the effectiveness and functionality of its MCS system, for example, at any one time what are the proportion of authorised vessels without a functioning VMS and what action is taken.

I would be grateful if you could circulate this material for the information and consideration of the Compliance Committee.

The following three Sri Lankan flagged IMUL vessels have recently been sighted inside BIOT waters:

IMULA-1853-MTR. - position Lat 03-33S Lon 069-21E. The vessel was sighted with several nets in the water and presumed to be IUU. It turned off its AIS when approached. The vessel is on the IOTC Record of Authorised Vessels, number 1755 and authorised until 28 April 2023. According to the records the vessel is both owned and operated by TK ABEYSOORIYA of Senagiri, Jayabodhiya Rd, Gandara.

IMULA-0680-CHW - position Lat 03-26S, Lon 069-28E. The vessel was sighted with four nets in the water and assumed to be IUU. They were marked with AIS units, MMSI 417068032. The vessel is on the IOTC Record of Authorised Vessels, number 16008 and authorised until 14 December 2022. According to the records the vessel is both owned and operated by WJLS FERNANDO of Srimal, Thoduwawa South, Thoduwawa.

Subashi Duwa 1 - Lat 03-33.4'S, Long 069-55.6'E. The vessel does not appear to be on the list of authorised vessels.

In respect of our bilateral cooperation to combat illegal fishing we would kindly request the assistance of DFAR to recall these vessels to port immediately and notify the relevant port authorities of the need for an investigation. We would be grateful if you could 1) Conduct a regulatory investigation into the activities of these vessels, including their vessel monitoring systems (VMS) data and share this with us; 2.) Confirm the identity of these vessels and the status of their various authorisations; 3.) Following your investigation, provide us with an early indication of any legal action against the owners and Masters (skipper) of the vessels that you plan to implement through the Sri Lankan authorities.

As required in paragraphs 5 and 6 of Resolution 18/03 please find attached a completed IOTC Reporting Form for Illegal Activity and accompanying evidence supporting: IUU fishing activity in BIOT waters; fishing contrary to Sri Lankan Fisheries laws and to IOTC Conservation Management Measures for the Sri Lankan flagged vessel IMULA2044MTR (Natalia). Under the bilateral arrangement established between UK and Sri Lanka in order to combat IUU, this vessel was reported to the Sri Lankan Authorities with a request that they investigate the activities of the vessel and take action against the owner/master under the provisions of national fisheries legislation (FARA 1996/2013).

The attached evidence shows that:

- The vessel IMULA2044MTR (Natalia) was not on the IOTC Record of Authorised Vessels (RAV) and had no authorisation to fish on the high seas.
- This vessel was boarded and inspected on 16 October 2022, the catch included skipjack tuna.
- Sri Lanka took action in respect of this vessel: The skipper's licence was suspended for 6 months; the owner has settled an administrative penalty and the vessel added to DFAR's Risk Vessel List.

UK is satisfied that the flag State has taken effective action and applied sanctions of adequate severity. We submit this vessel to the IOTC Compliance Committee with the recommendation 'a) Notification to IOTC Secretariat only. No further action is recommended'.

Resolution 18/03 On establishing a list of vessels presumed to have carried out IUU fishing in the IOTC Area of Competence: Sri Lankan flagged Vessel IMUL-A-0869-CHW (Holly Trinity).

As required in paragraphs 5 and 6 of Resolution 18/03 please find attached a completed IOTC Reporting Form for Illegal Activity and accompanying evidence supporting: IUU fishing activity in BIOT waters; fishing contrary to IOTC Conservation Management Measures for the Sri Lankan flagged vessel IMUL-A-0869-CHW (Holly Trinity). Under the bilateral arrangement established between UK and Sri Lanka in order to combat IUU, this vessel was reported to the Sri Lankan Authorities with a request that they investigate the activities of the vessel and take action against the owner/master under the provisions of national fisheries legislation (FARA 1996/2013).

The attached evidence shows that:

- The vessel was on the IOTC Record of Authorised Vessels, IOTC Number: 17164 at the time of inspection.
- On the 8th November, 2022 the Senior Fisheries Protection Officer boarded and inspected the vessel Holly Trinity (IMUL-A-0869-CHW). The vessel had all fishing gear stowed but appeared to have fresh fish on board and apparent fishing tracks on the plotter. It was presumed IUU in BIOT waters and was reported to Sri Lanka on 17 November 2022.
- The vessel did have a VMS on board which was not functional due to a faulty alternator.
- The vessel had a National logbook on board but there had been no entry since 05/06/2022.
- On 25 January 2023 Sri Lanka provided details of the actions it had taken (Appendix IV of the IOTC IUU Reporting Form). Sri Lanka reported that logbook pages were duly filled, indicating that they had been completed retrospectively. We note that an investigation is pending.

We submit this vessel to IOTC Compliance Committee with recommendation b) 'Notification of illegal activity to IOTC Secretariat. Recommend notification of activity to flag State.'. This recommendation is made noting the following:

• We note that an investigation is pending. UK assert that the vessel was illegally fishing in BIOT waters (fresh fish on board; tracks on the plotter indicative of fishing activity; National Logbook incomplete). To date Sri Lanka have only commented on the logbook which appears to have been completed retrospectively. UK awaits further details from the investigation.

• The vessel was on the IOTC RAV and therefore should have a functioning VMS on board it appears it did not. This represents one of a number of cases noted by UK where Sri Lanka's Monitoring Control and Surveillance and VMS appear not to be functioning. No VMS details were provided to UK. UK requests, but rarely receives any VMS details from Sri Lanka in respect of its vessels' activities in BIOT waters.

We invite Sri Lanka to explain to the Compliance Committee how an authorised vessel is able to leave port without a functioning VMS and if it failed during the trip, why it had not been recalled to port sooner. We further invite Sri Lanka to explain to the Compliance Committee the effectiveness and functionality of its MCS system, for example, at any one time what are the proportion of authorised vessels without a functioning VMS and what action is taken.

Noting that this vessel was presumed to be fishing illegally in BIOT without a licence, that Resolution 18/03 Paragraph 5 enables vessels engaged in IUU fishing activities within a 24 month period prior to the meeting of the Compliance Committee to be reported, BIOT will present this vessel for inclusion on the draft IUU vessels list in 2024 pending the outcome of the full investigation and if Sri Lanka has not demonstrated that effective action has been taken, including prosecution and imposition of sanctions of adequate severity (Resolution 18/03 para 14d). We further invite Sri Lanka to prove additional details to the Compliance Committee in 2023.

I would be grateful if you could circulate this material for the information and consideration of the Compliance Committee.

At 07:03 the captain read BC 3. The chart plotter was photographed for its GPS position and the Boarding location confirmation report was signed by the captain and a crew member. 4 fishing locations were observed to have been plotted on the chart labelled 0 to 3.

At 07:16 the captain read BC 5. The captain pointed to the VMS and he then pointed to a yellow sack on the floor and stated "Battery no charge". The bag contained an alternator. The alternator was removed and photographed. It was noted that the chart plotter was on for the duration of the inspection and this was photographed by the SFPO on entering the bridge at 07:02 for the Boarding location confirmation report).

The radio was switched on at 07:22 when the captain read BC 6 and BC 7. It was functional and photographed working. The VMS monitoring unit had no lights showing. It had no power. It was photographed. BC 8 was also read at 07:22.

At 07:29 the captain produced the National Fishing Logbook. The last entry was 05/06/2022.

At 07:35 the captain read BC 11. The SFPO referred to the Boat departure form and the captain agreed that the last signature and entry was on the 23/09/2022 by coastguard.

At 07:36 the captain read BC 10. He muttered "Dikovita".

At 07:40 the captain read BC 12. He stated that he was going to "Sri Lanka".

At 07:42 the captain read BC 13. He stated he had 35 fish onboard. He then pointed to all the red tracks at the bottom of the chart which showed they may have been caught in the north, despite the FV coming from the south and being a considerable distance from them. The SFPO asked why he had no tracks in BIOT and he stated because the alternator was broken.

At 07:46 the captain read BC 14 and the SFPO was shown the hold. The SFPO photographed the hold. The SFPO noted that on the floor of the hold between the storage areas that 3 tuna had loose ice thrown over them to cover them and that they were not stored properly (in plastic bags). The compactness, hardness, colour and quality of the ice indicated that this had been done very recently (Image: PB080092). The SFPO asked for a bait container (photographed at 07:54), a white sack containing fish on ice and 2 tunas to be brought up onto deck. The sack contained 4 large Sky emperor, *Lethrinus mahsena*, indicative of fishing from the bank on sea grass beds (due to their colour). Due to their size, colour and gill colour (freshness 2) it was considered that the only place they could have been caught was Great Chagos Bank on extensive areas of seagrass known to home large *Lethrinus mahsena*. The closest location is south of Nelson Island, the direction from which this fishing vessel was travelling.

NB: Inspection report 015AJK. The FV inspected 06/11/2022 to 07/11/2022 departed Sri Lanka around the same time as this FV and also had a VMS problem and was inspected NE of Nelson.

On 8th November 2022 the Senior Fisheries Protection Officer boarded and inspected the vessel HOLLY TRINITY (IMUL-A-0869-MTR). Although the gear was stowed, the vessel appeared to have fresh fish on board and apparent fishing tracks on the plotter. In addition had not submitted a transit report and although it did have a VMS on board it was not working due to a faulty alternator. The vessel did have a national logbook on board but there had been no entry into it since 05/06/2022

An inspection report for the vessel is attached.

We would be grateful if you could investigate the activities of this vessel regarding any fishing outside in BIOT waters. Following your investigation, we would also be grateful for an early indication of whether you plan to request that Sri Lankan authorities deal with the vessel if it is confirmed that it is in violation of the fisheries regulations of Sri Lanka.

Resolution 18/03 On establishing a list of vessels presumed to have carried out IUU fishing in the IOTC Area of Competence: Indian flagged Vessel IND-TN-15-MM-9070 (AVE MARIYA)

As required in paragraphs 5 and 6 of Resolution 18/03 please find attached a completed IOTC Reporting form for Illegal Activity and accompanying evidence supporting: IUU fishing activity in BIOT waters; fishing contrary to IOTC Conservation Management Measures for the Indian flagged vessel IND-TN-15-MM-9070 (AVE MARIYA).

This vessel was included on the IOTC IUU vessels list in May 2022. At that time no physical boarding of the vessel had been possible due to Covid Protocols and no details of its registration were available. The current boarding on 25th January 2023, made by the same Senior fisheries Officer as in 2022, obtained registration documents. The vessel Captain was the same as on previous inspections in 2022 and the SFPO confirmed the vessel to be the same. The vessel registration dates from 30/07/2022 (see Figs 5 and 6 of the Inspection Report).

The attached evidence shows that:

- The vessel was not on the current IOTC Record of Authorised Vessels and was unauthorised to fish.
- The vessel was boarded and inspected on 25 January 2023. The vessel was fishing illegally without a licence within BIOT waters. The current inspection was the third in BIOT waters
- The vessel did not submit a transit report prior to entry into the FCMZ; it had no VMS present onboard.
- Species identified from hold inspections included IOTC managed species, swordfish (Xiphias gladius)
- UK notified the details of this vessel to India on 2 February 2023.

As this vessel is already IUU listed we submit this vessel to IOTC Compliance Committee with recommendation b) '*Notification of illegal activity to IOTC Secretariat. Recommend notification of activity to flag State.*'

We highlight this case to the Compliance Committee. This case demonstrates a complete disregard by India of IOTC Conservation Management Measures and a failure to implement flag State Controls. To date, India has provided no evidence of the actions it has taken against this IUU listed vessel. Not only has it not impounded this vessel, the vessel was registered after the IUU listing.

It is clear that India is unable to effectively implement its flag State Controls and provides no evidence that it is able to take effective action in response to IUU fishing activities, including

prosecution and imposition of sanctions of adequate severity to be effective in securing compliance and deterring further infringements. We call on India to provide a detailed explanation as to how this vessel, IND-TN-15-MM-9070 (AVE MARIYA) is still able to fish despite being IUU listed, and to respond to the points set out on page 2 of the document 'Draft IUU Vessel List, Attachment 1 - Additional Information – UK'.

I would be grateful if you could circulate this material for the information and consideration of the Compliance Committee. Thank you.

Dear Dr Pandey

Report on the inspection of the Indian flagged vessel IND-TN-15-MM-9070 (AVE MARIYA) in the waters of the British Indian Ocean Territory (BIOT) and request for assistance.

The Indian flagged vessel IND-TN-15-MM-9070 (AVE MARIYA) was boarded and inspected on suspicion of being involved in illegal activities, namely illegal fishing in BIOT waters on 25 January 2023. The vessel had been fishing in BIOT waters for at least a week and there were fresh fish on board including IOTC managed species Swordfish (Xiphias gladius). The vessel was not on the IOTC list of Authorised Fishing Vessels. The vessel had not submitted a transit reporting form to the BIOT Authorities. The vessel was fishing illegally without a licence within BIOT waters, and was instructed to leave BIOT waters immediately.

We note that the vessel is from Tamil Nadu. We would kindly request your assistance to recall the vessel to port immediately and notify the relevant persons in the State and port authorities of the need for an investigation. We would be grateful if you could 1) Conduct a regulatory investigation into the activities of this vessel including any vessel monitoring system (VMS) data; 2) Following your investigation, provide us with an early indication of any legal action against the owner and Master (skippers) of the vessel that you plan to implement through the Indian / State authorities regarding any violation of the fisheries regulations of India. This would include illegal fishing in the waters of a third State, namely BIOT.

This vessel was included on the IOTC IUU Vessels List in May 2022. The vessel registration dates from 30/07/2022 (see Figs 5 and 6 of the Inspection Report) which is after the vessel was included on the IUU Vessels List and thus demonstrates a complete disregard of IOTC Conservation Management Measures and a failure to implement flag State Controls. These details will be reported to the IOTC Compliance Committee.
