## **REPORTING OF MANDATORY FISHERIES STATISTICS FOR THE YEAR 2022 TO THE IOTC**

This letter provides the first reminder for the reporting of mandatory fisheries statistics according to the provisions set in IOTC Resolutions  $\underline{15/01}$ ,  $\underline{15/02}$ ,  $\underline{12/04}$ ,  $\underline{12/06}$ ,  $\underline{13/04}$ ,  $\underline{13/05}$ ,  $\underline{17/05}$ ,  $\underline{18/02}$ ,  $\underline{18/07}$ ,  $\underline{19/01}$ ,  $\underline{19/02}$ ,  $\underline{19/03}$ , and  $\underline{21/01}$ .

Contracting Parties and Cooperating Non-Contracting Parties (CPCs) of the IOTC that have not yet submitted complete statistics for the statistical year 2022 are encouraged to provide this information no later than 30 June 2023.

For all CPCs reporting on longline fisheries, the data may be submitted as *preliminary* with the deadline for the submission of *final* data being no later than 30 December 2023.

All data should *preferably* be submitted using the recommended IOTC forms available as MS Excel spreadsheets and designed to provide guidance to the CPCs on the required fields and contents expected for each type of dataset to be reported to the IOTC Secretariat. The IOTC forms greatly facilitate the management of the data received through their harmonisation while ensuring the CPCs comply with IOTC standards and code lists. The <u>notes for the completion of IOTC forms</u> and the <u>guidelines for the reporting of fisheries statistics to the IOTC</u> provide details on how to compile the original data and fill the forms. CPCs are requested to refer to **Table 1** below to determine the number and extent of file submissions for each type of dataset expected by the deadlines.

CPCs are advised to submit all statistical data either by email *exclusively* to <u>IOTC-Statistics@fao.org</u> (with <u>IOTC-Statistics@fao.org</u>) or through the <u>e-MARIS</u> platform. The subject of the e-mail should include a clear reference to the submitting CPC and to the IOTC resolution(s) the data are related to (e.g., <*CPC\_code*>\_15/02\_4SF).

For reasons of transparency and security, the submission of official data via file sharing services (e.g., *Dropbox, Google Drive, Microsoft OneDrive* or similar) will not be accepted. CPCs are requested to contact the IOTC Secretariat in advance if files are too large to be sent by email.
