## IOTC CIRCULAR 2023–54

Dear Sir/Madam,

## REVISED COMPLIANCE ASSESSMENT CRITERIA – APPENDIX V, IOTC RULES OF PROCEDURE (2023)

At its 27th Session in May 2023, the Commission adopted a revised Rules of Procedure. One of the approved amendments in the newly adopted Rules of Procedure is Appendix V, which pertains to the work of the Compliance Committee.

As a result of the amendments to the procedures of the Compliance Committee, the Secretariat is proposing the attached document to assist CPCs to understand the effects of applying the new assessment criteria listed in Appendix V, including its Annex A. The primary purpose of preparing and disseminating the attached document is to inform CPCs about how compliance personnel will be objectively guided in their tasks of conducting compliance assessments. This will ultimately lead to the creation of CPCs' draft IOTC Compliance Reports.

Should any CPC require any further clarifications on the attached document, the Secretariat shall be happy to have a one-to-one virtual meeting with the concerned CPC, or a group virtual meeting if there is more than one CPC requesting further clarifications. To assist us in planning for this eventuality, I would request that CPCs contact the Secretariat as soon as possible (no later than 30 September 2023). This will allow the Secretariat to work with the concerned CPC(s) to decide on a date and time that would be convenient for all concerned parties for the virtual consultation(s).

I also wish to advise CPCs that the review of "Compliance Assessment Criteria", as has been done in previous years, will not take place at the next Working Party on the Implementation of Conservation and Management Measures (WPICMM) meeting due to the urgent requirement for all concerned parties to be of the same understanding on the application of these assessment criteria.
