### HOW TO INTERPRET TERMINOLOGY CONTAINED IN THIS REPORT

This report has been written using the following terms and associated definitions so as to removeambiguity surrounding how particular paragraphs should be interpreted.

### Level 1: From a subsidiary body of the Commission to the next level in the structure of the Commission:

**RECOMMENDED, RECOMMENDATION**: Any conclusion or request for an action to be undertaken, from a subsidiarybody of the Commission (Committee or Working Party), which is to be formally provided to the next level in the structure of the Commission for its consideration/endorsement (e.g., from a Working Party to the Scientific Committee; from a Committee to the Commission). The intention is that the higher body will consider the recommended action for endorsement under its own mandate, if the subsidiary body does not already have the required mandate. Ideally this should be task specific and contain a timeframe for completion.

# Level 2: From a subsidiary body of the Commission to a Contracting Party or Cooperating Non-ContractingParty (CPC), the IOTC Secretariat, or other body (not the Commission) to carry out a specified task:

**REQUESTED**: This term should only be used by a subsidiary body of the Commission if it does not wish to have the request formally adopted/endorsed by the next level in the structure of the Commission. For example, if a Committee wishes to seek additional input from a CPC on a particular topic, but does not wish to formalize the request beyond the mandate of the Committee, it may request that a set action be undertaken. Ideally this shouldbe task specific and contain a timeframe for the completion.

#### *Level 3: General terms to be used for consistency:*

**AGREED**: Any point of discussion from a meeting which the IOTC body considers to be an agreed course of action covered by its mandate, which has not already been dealt with under Level 1 or level 2 above; a general point of agreement among delegations/participants of a meeting which does not need to be considered/adopted by the nextlevel in the Commission's structure.

**NOTED/NOTING**: Any point of discussion from a meeting which the IOTC body considers to be important enough torecord in a meeting report for future reference.

**Any other term:** Any other term may be used in addition to the Level 3 terms to highlight to the reader of the IOTC report, the importance of the relevant paragraph. However, other terms used are considered for explanatory/informational purposes only and shall have no higher rating within the reporting terminology hierarchythan Level 3, described above (e.g., **CONSIDERED**; **URGED**; **ACKNOWLEDGED**).

#### **Background information**

The Indian Ocean Tuna Commission (IOTC) Performance Reviews (2009 and 2015) contained recommendations that the IOTC should develop a comprehensive monitoring, control and surveillance (MCS) system, including a Catch Documentation Scheme (CDS). In particular:

- i. IOTC should develop a comprehensive monitoring, control and surveillance (MCS) system through the implementation of the measures already in force, and through the adoption of new measures and tools such as possible on-board regional observers' scheme, a possible catch documentation scheme as well as a possible system on boarding and inspection. *Recommendation 51, IOTC-2009-PRIOTC01-R 56 pp.*
- ii. the IOTC should continue to develop a comprehensive MCS system through the implementation of the measures already in force, and through the adoption of new measures and tools such as a possible catch documentation scheme, noting the process currently being undertaken within the FAO. Paragraph 149 (a), IOTC—2016—PRIOTCO2—R: 86 pp.

These recommendations were adopted by the Commission and were the basis for an in-depth appraisal for the development of an electronic CDS (e-CDS) for the IOTC, and the results of the appraisal were presented at a workshop in Maputo, Mozambique, on 12 February 2019. This workshop recommended that a Working Group be constituted to guide the development of a CDS Strategy. The recommendation was subsequently endorsed by the second meeting of the Working Party on the Implementation of Conservation and Management Measures (WPICMM02), the Compliance Committee (CoC16) and the Commission (S23).

Subsequently, seven Catch Documentation Scheme Working Group (CDSWG) meetings have been held. In response to a recommendation from the third meeting of the CDSWG, the Commission endorsed the Terms of Reference in November 2020. The fourth meeting of the CDSWG (CDSWG04) was the first meeting after the endorsement of the Terms of Reference. This report provides a record of the Eighth CDSWG (CDSWG08), as agreed to by the participants of that meeting.

#### 1. OPFNING OF THE MEETING

- 1. The meeting was held in person and online, via Zoom, on 13 February 2023.
- 2. The List of Participants is presented in <u>Appendix 1</u>. A total of 48 participants attended the meeting. The meeting was chaired by Dr Indra Jaya (IDN).
- 3. The Chair **INVITED** participants to introduce themselves.

# 2. ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA AND ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE MEETING

4. The CDSWG08 **ADOPTED** the agenda provided in Appendix 2.

#### 3. ADMISSION OF OBSERVERS

4. The CDSWG08 **NOTED** the admission of observers from Sustainable Fisheries and Community Trust (SFACT), PEW Charitable Trusts (PEW), World Wide Fund for Nature (WWF) and Invited Experts and **FURTHER NOTED** that there was no objection to their attendance.

#### 4. REVIEW OF STATUS OF MEMBERSHIP TO THE CDS WG

- 5. The CDSWG08 **NOTED** 106 nominees of the CDS Working Group as follows:
  - 24 CPCs with 94 nominees;
  - Four observers with nine nominees; and
  - Three Invited Experts.

# 5. REVIEW AND DISCUSSION OF THE DRAFT CDS STRATEGY DOCUMENTS

- The CDSWG08 NOTED paper <u>IOTC-2023-CDSWG08-02</u>, the draft IOTC Catch Documentation Strategy and FURTHER NOTED paper <u>IOTC-2023-CDSWG08-03</u>, the IOTC CDS Strategy Companion, which provides background and justification for the different elements of the strategy proper.
- 7. The CDSWG08 **NOTED** that for artisanal fishermen who do not have the means of communication or literacy to operate a CDS system, the operators or buyers could fill in the estimated catch certificate for validation by the Coastal State.
- 8. The CDSWG08 **NOTED** that it may be impractical to introduce the three tropical species and swordfish at once, and **FURTHER NOTED** that introduction immediately of fresh tuna and processed products would be challenging.
- 9. The CDSWG08 **AGREED** that the implementation schedule of the transition from trade-based CDS to fishery-based CDS for artisanal fisheries should be subject to further decision by the Commission.
- 10. The CDSWG08 **AGREED** that the introduction of the three tropical species and swordfish, and of different product types should be gradual.
- 11. The CDSWG08 **AGREED** that the Commission should consider whether the CDS should be expanded to all 16 species on risk basis.

- 12. The CDSWG08 **AGREED** that Expected Result 0 in the draft CDS Strategy should be renamed Overall Expected Result.
- 13. The CDSWG08 **NOTED** that the same species are imported by IOTC CPCs from countries that are not members of IOTC, and therefore might require the trade CDS to be satisfied that the product is not from IOTC.
- 14. CDSWG08 **AGREED** to add text for imports from non-CPCs to paragraph 0.1 of the draft CDS Strategy, to reflect the need for consultation with other RFMOs and non-members of IOTC.
- 15. The CDSWG08 **AGREED** that the outcome of the pilot trials should lead to consideration of stepwise introduction of species.
- 16. The CDSWG08 **AGREED** that the transition from trade-based to fishery-based CDS for artisanal fisheries be included in Result 2 activities.
- 17. The CDSWG08 **NOTED** that the MCS CDS consultant's report had recommended that all IOTC species be covered.
- 18. The CDSWG08 **AGREED** to include Compliance as an assessment criterion in the CDS Strategy, which would indicate the level of implementation of the CDS by different CPCs and identify reasons for non-compliance and their possible solutions.
- 19. The CDSWG08 **AGREED** that the timeline (and the logical framework) should be synchronised with the text where changes have been made by the CDSWG08.
- 20. The CDSWG08 **REQUESTED** the Secretariat adopt the text that has been agreed in the CDSWG08, and leave in track changes those additions that the Secretariat has been asked to draft, and then to distribute a v2.0 to participants before presentation to the Compliance Committee.

#### 6. DATES OF THE NEXT CDSWG MEETINGS

21. The CDSWG08 **AGREED** that the next meeting be held from 11h00 to 15h00 Seychelles time (UTC+4) in the fourth week of September and **FURTHER AGREED** that the meeting will be virtual.

#### 7. ANY OTHER MATTERS

22. The Report of the meeting was adopted by correspondence on 07 March 2023.
