		partment of Fisheries in Thailand has been con-
		ducting data collection on coastal tuna and tuna-like
		species through incidental sampling from purse
		seiners at the port on a monthly basis. However,
		this sampling method has certain limitations. For in-
		stance, there may be instances where no purse sein-
		ers catch tuna or tuna-like species during the data
		collection period, or no purse seiners are present
		at all during that time. Additionally, monsoon winds
		along the Andaman Sea coast can prevent fishing
		vessels from operating throughout the year.
		Furthermore, the previous measurement of tuna and
		tuna-like species lengths was conducted by a few
		official from the Marine Fisheries Research and De-
		velopment Division. This limited approach resulted
		in a small amount of data being collected compared
		to the total number of purse seiners catching aquatic
		animals. Consequently, there is insufficient infor-
		mation on the length of tuna and tuna-like species
		to fully comply with the requirements of the IOTC
		conservation and management measures.
		Despite this, Thailand will continue conducting
		monthly surveys on fish landings from purse seine
		vessels operating in Thai waters within the IOTC's
		area of competence. These surveys have been part
		of our national fisheries data collection program
		since 2016. Moreover, Thailand has initiated a trial
		project aimed at improving the size frequency re-
		ports submitted to the IOTC. This project will in-
		volve an enumerator who will exclusively collect data
		on IOTC species from purse seine vessels land-
		ing at the main fishing ports along the Andaman
		Sea coast. The enumerator will primarily collect fish
		length data and, where possible, other biological
		data. The project is expected to run from 1st January
		2025 to 31st December 2026. We hope this project
		will help us fully comply with the IOTC CMM.
