Clarification and Technical Supplement to Somalia's Formal Objection TO IOTC Resolutions 25/03, 25/04, 25/08 and 25/09

Dear Executive Secretary,

Following the submission and circulation of Somalia's formal objection dated April 23, 2025, with reference: MFBE/OM/550/04/25, circulated on May 6, 2025, reference: IOTC CIRCULAR 2025-18, concerning Somalia's Objection to Resolutions 25/03, 25/04, 25/08, and 25/09 adopted at the 29th Session of the IOTC Commission, we hereby submit this Supplementary Clarification Note.

This note serves to:

- Correct the legal reference cited in the original submission;
- 2. Ensure procedural completeness in accordance with the IOTC Agreement.

The original letter mistakenly cited Articles XXII and XVI. We clarify that Article IX (5) of the IOTC Agreement provides the correct legal basis:

"Any Member of the Commission may, within 120 days... object to a conservation and management measure... A Member which has objected... shall not be bound thereby."

Accordingly, Somalia's objections submitted on April 23, 2025, within 120 days of the adoption of the relevant measures in May 2025 are legally valid and consistent with Article IX (5).

Somalia affirms that it shall not be bound by the contested measures in accordance with Article IX(5). While the term "binding application" was previously used, we now clarify that Somalia's objection has the effect of non-application. Somalia also reserves the right to review, withdraw, or amend its objection should revised, equitable proposals be introduced.
