Dear Chair.

Greetings from the BOBP-IGO!

I am writing this to formally request that the BOBP-IGO be granted observer status at the meetings of the Indian Ocean Tuna Commission (IOTC).

BOBP-IGO is a regional fisheries body established in 2003 and mandated to promote the sustainable management and development of fisheries in the Bay of Bengal region. Our Governing Council comprises the Governments of Bangladesh, India, Maldives, and Sri Lanka – all of whom are active Contracting Parties to the IOTC.

At the XIII Governing Council Meeting of BOBP-IGO, the Member Countries passed a resolution recommending that BOBP-IGO and IOTC work closely to advance mutual objectives on sustainable fisheries management, Monitoring, Control and Surveillance (MCS), capacity development, and regional cooperation in the Indian Ocean.

BOBP-IGO's participation as an observer at IOTC meetings will support the following:

- Enhanced regional coordination on tuna and tuna-like species management, particularly in the Bay of Bengal sub-region.
- Facilitation of capacity-building initiatives aligned with IOTC conservation and management measures.
- Bridging national fisheries agencies and IOTC processes, improving information flow and stakeholder engagement in the region.
- We are committed to contributing constructively to the work of the Commission and believe that our
 presence will strengthen regional cooperation and sustainable fisheries governance.
