












## REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

This Resolution strengthens the foregoing Resolution 09/06 and Recommendation 05/08, which were pursuing the same goal of protecting marine turtles. The Resolution takes into account, and gives continuance to the intent of other Conventions, Agreements and Organisations in the domain of conserving sea turtles; such as CITES, the IOSEA MoU, or the FAO Guidelines to Reduce Sea Turtle Mortality in Fishing Operations.

There are 4 reporting requirements for the Flag State for this Resolution, pertaining to report to the IOTC Secretariat of interactions, the Scientific Committee on successful mitigation measures, and the Commission on implementation of the FAO Guidelines. CPCs that undertake research on circle hooks, whole finfish bait, FADs designs, alternative handling practices, gillnet design and fishing practices are also 'requested' to report the results to the Commission.



There are different templates for the reporting requirements on this resolution depending to who the data and information shall be provided.



REPORTING REQUIREMENT 1:
ALL DATA ON INTERACTIONS WITH MARINE TURTLES BY 30 JUNE EACH YEAR TO THE IOTC SECRETARIAT

#### **IMPLEMENTATION**

- <u>How to report:</u> The flag State CPC should use the data report template related to discards.
- Reporting format: Data must be submitted in specified file format. The template spread-sheet forms can be accessed under http://www.iotc.org/data/requested-statistics-and-submission-forms
- Where to send the information: The report should be mailed to iotc-secretariat@fao.org

#### **REPORTING REQUIREMENT 2:**

REPORT TO THE COMMISSION IN THE ANNUAL IMPLEMENTATION REPORT, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE X OF THE AGREEMENT, THEIR PROGRESS IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE FAO GUIDELINES AND THIS RESOLUTION

- <u>How to report:</u> The flag State should report in the Implementation Report, part C, wherein it details the progress in the implementation of the FAO Guidelines and this Resolution.

#### **REPORTING REQUIREMENT 3:**

REPORT TO THE SCIENTIFIC COMMITTEE ON ANY SUCCESSFUL MITIGATION MEASURES AND OTHER IMPACTS ON MARINE TURTLES IN THE IOTC AREA OF COMPETENCE, SUCH AS THE DETERIORATION OF NESTING SITES AND SWALLOWING OF MARINE DEBRIS

- Reporting format: In the National Scientific Report.




#### REPORTING REQUIREMENT 4:

REPORT TO THE SCIENTIFIC COMMITTEE ON THE RESULTS OF RESEARCH TRIALS OF CIRCLE HOOKS, USE OF WHOLEFISH FOR BAIT, ALTERNATIVE FADS DESIGNS, ALTERNATIVE HANDLING TECHNIQUES, GILLNET DEIGN AND FISHING PRACTICES AND ANY OTHER MITIGATION METHODS WHICH IMPROVE THE MITIGATION OF ADVERSE EFFECTS ON MARINE TURTLES

#### **IMPLEMENTATION**

- <u>How to report:</u> The flag State should report in the National Scientific Report, wherein it details any new mitigation measures that were successful, or any other impacts on marine turtles.
- Reporting format: In the National Scientific Report.
- Where to send: The report should be mailed to iotc-secretariat@fao.org



## **COOPERATION REQUIREMENTS**

There are none in this resolution.

## **OBLIGATIONS OF THE INDUSTRY**

Industry are required to report details on interactions with marine turtles to their flag State authorities through the logbook programme.

## OBLIGATIONS OF THE SECRETARIAT

The IOTC and IOSEA Secretariats are to intensify their collaboration and information exchange on marine turtles in accordance with Commission protocols.

## **OBLIGATIONS OF THE COMMISSION & BODIES**

The Scientific Committee shall:

- Task the working Party on Ecosystems and Bycatch to:
  - a) Develop recommendations on appropriate mitigation measures for gillnet, longline and purse seine fisheries in the IOTC area;
  - b) Develop regional standards covering data collection, data exchange and training;
  - c) Develop improved FAD designs to reduce the incidence of entanglement of marine turtles, including the use of biodegradable materials.
- Review CPC reports and provide recommendations to the Commission to strengthen efforts to reduce turtle interactions in the IOTC fisheries.
