



REPORT ON THE IOTC RECORD OF ACTIVE VESSELS

Prepared by IOTC secretariat

This document summarises the observance of the information requirements of IOTC Resolution 05/04 (previously 98/04) Concerning registration and exchange of information on vessels, including flag of convenience vessels, fishing for tropical tunas and swordfish in the IOTC Area of competence by IOTC members

An historical summary of the implementation of this resolution is also provided, in response to a request from the Compliance Committee at Session 9

When no report is received from a flag state it cannot be assumed that none of their vessels were active in the Indian Ocean. This has been borne out on many occasions when the Secretariat has received data from a port state that might indicate that a vessel not reported by a particular flag state was active. Overall, errors and gaps in reporting will affect the representativeness of the Record of Active Vessels and limit its utility. Other parties report lists of vessels authorized to operate in the Indian Ocean (Resolution 05/02) instead of lists of active vessels. Consequently they might not realise that they have not met their obligations with respect to Resolution 05/04. Information on the status of reporting concerning IOTC Resolution 05/04 for 2004 is given in Table 2. The numbers of domestic and foreign vessels reported as having operated within the IOTC Area per year since the implementation of Resolution 05/04 are shown in tables 3 and 4, respectively.
